Before that, the eventual league champs gutted out a best-of-three qualifying victory over the Durham Lightning — overcoming an early series deficit to advance.

Mulé — a fast-skating forward with lots of play-making ability made the winning deposit in a 3-0 game-two whitewash and sank an insurance marker in a 5-1 seriesclinching win.

The Dolphins have also flourished in tournament play - most recently striking silver at the 35th annual Brampton showcase.

Their penchant for coming out

ahead in low-scoring affairs - certainly an encouraging sign heading into the provincials — was once again seen with narrow victories over Aurora (2-1), Michigan (3-1) and Chatham (3-0).

This round-robin sweep put them in the semifinals, where they 2-0. Durham blanked Unfortunately, Etobicoke would end up on the opposite end of the shutout game during championship play — getting stoned by London

This weekend's trip to the provincials was made possible by a best-of-three qualifying series win over North York in late February.

Eleven teams will compete for the Ontario title.

ing and were rock solid in both games last weekend.


Before that, the local girls' collective efforts powered Halton Hills to championship honours at the 35th annual Brampton Canadattes Tournament.
