

## Smoking banned in all public places except bingo hall, Mohawk Raceway Comment ......6-7

Smokers will have to take it outside as of May 31.

In a 5-4 vote Monday, Milton council approved a bylaw banning smoking in workplaces and public areas with the exception of Bingo Country, the gaming floor of Mohawk Slots and private clubs.

"We, as elected officials, have an obligation to protect the health and well being of the people we represent. By passing this bylaw, we will be doing what's right for our citiSee related stories on pages 13 and 22

Councillor Rick Malboeuf, who chaired the Smoking Bylaw Review Committee (SBRC), which recommended the approved

"Seventy-five per cent of the population doesn't smoke. These people have the right to go out and be in public places without having to expose themselves or their children to the hazards and dangers of secondhand smoke."

In the case of Mohawk Raceway, smoking will be banned from every area except half of the gaming floor and half of the bleachers.

Bingo Country has agreed to install a designated smoking room by January 2004, following an as-of-yet unscheduled move.

Private clubs will be allowed to permit smoking as long as the club isn't open to the public at the time.

Facilities deemed to be in contra-

diction with the bylaw could face a \$5,000 fine.

Exemptions were granted to Bingo Country and Mohawk Slots based on information they provided to the review committee surrounding profit losses in areas where smoking bans have been enacted.

According to information gathered by Bingo Country, profits from their bingo operation in Kitchener dropped from \$1,112,202 to \$558,5886 after the ban was instituted in 1999.
