Town council postpones firefighting agreement

A reciprocal firefighting agreement with the Guelph/Eramosa fire department has been postponed following anxiety over response times.

Councillor Barry Lee raised concern about the neighbouring fire department's geographically knowledge of north Milton at a community services committee meeting April 8.

At that time, Fire Chief Harold Penson was instructed to discuss routing plans with the Guelph/Eramosa fire chief in time for Monday's town council meeting. However, more time was granted by council for the chief to prepare a report to council.

Construction crews and utility companies

were given the green light by town council Monday to extend their hours during the Main Street re-construction project.

An exemption to the Town's noise bylaw allows crews to work between 6 a.m. and 11

Three seats on the Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee (LACAC) are now reserved for local historical society representatives.

The three were granted inclusion in the committee Monday by town council.

Two seats will go to the Milton Historical Society and one seat to the Nasagiweya Historical Society.

Council Briefs

Their inclusion stems from a request to be directly involved in issuing demolition permits for historically significant buildings. LACAC has to sign off on all projects for permit approval.

The Town of Milton and Halton Region are combining their efforts to create a community

garden at the Allendale Long Term Care Facility.

Milton council approved the project Monday, while regional council granted their approval March 27.

The speed limit on Appleby Line — between Steeles Avenue and No. 14 Sideroad - has beeen reduced from 80 km/h to 60 km/h for safety reasons.

Town council approved the move Monday, agreeing with a staff report indicating the reduction is necessary to improve the safety of the road.

I see it all the time with people called Christian. Too many people too stressed out, too burdened down, too burnt out and too beat up. One of the major reasons this happens is because we think life is all about us. We are the centre of the universe. We manipulate and over control everything possible. Someone who will walk into our hurting homes, messed up marriages, mismanaged finances, failing businesses and even our difficult church life. We need someone to step in and do the stuff that only a hero can do.
