In the Senior Boys' High Jump, Chris Karnel claimed gold with a jump of 1.91 meters, breaking the 10-year-old school record. He also set a new school record in the Senior Boys' Shot Put with a throw of 13.90 meters. Second place performances were claimed by Mike McGill in the Midget Boys' 1500 meters, Julie Iantorno in the Midget Girls' Long Jump, Mike Carn in the Midget Boys' Shot Put and Mike Rubino in the Midget Boys' 100 meters. The Midget Boys' Sprint Relay composed of Ian Butcher, Rob Dunn, Daren Izumi and Mike Rubino claimed third place.




The track & field team was out practicing this past week, on Monday and Wednesday. Any wanna be track stars are invited to come out and join the team.


