


Outdoor lovers go to Extreme measures




Attention Halton Gardeners! Spring Compost Give-Away

Every year, Halton's drinking water is quality tested more than 125,000 times. It has consistently tested safe, meeting the required Ontario Drinking Water Standards.

Halton Region's Water Quality Quarterly Report (January-March 2002) is now available. The report provides detailed information about where Halton's drinking water comes from, what it contains, and how it compares to the Ontario Drinking Water Standards.

Save Water... Save Money.

Water conservation makes sense, and it's easy. Since most households' water use increases in the summer months, Halton's Water Efficiency Program is pleased to provide these simple, effective tips to keep your water costs down:

- ♦ Your lawn only needs 2.5 cm (1 inch) of water per week to stay healthy and green. Try using an empty tuna can rain gauge to measure;
- Cover swimming pools when not in use to reduce evaporation;
- Sweep driveways and sidewalks instead of using a hose; Leave grass clippings on the lawn - they are an excellent source of nitrogen and moisture.
- In planning your garden, select plants that require less water.


