Local boxer rebounds from knockdown to prevail

Matt Hart Jr. took home a different kind of souvenir from his latest in-ring encounter.

The Milton pugilist came away with a rather nasty shiner — the result of a second-round straight-away right from Toronto's Evril Cartey Saturday night at Atlas Boxing Club.

It's a memento the up-and-coming middleweight has worn with pride this past week. After all, a few days of discomfort pales in comparison to the lasting satisfaction of victory.

And that's exactly what Hart Jr. achieved bringing his career win total to seven with what he called his most challenging bout to date.

"I was originally supposed to fight a Russian guy named Igor Barotov, but he was a no-show.


So they put me up against Evril. He was much more seasoned. He's fast, strong and tough."

From the onset, it looked like those attributes were going to be too much to contend with for Hart Jr. — who less than a minute into round one was floored by the hometown favourite with a right uppercut, overhand right combination.

But Milton's fighter was far from done.

Rallying with an authority that surprised many in attendance and probably stunned his opponent, he battled back to actually take the first round plus the two which followed.

"I think he thought I was finished," recalled Hart Jr. "But my coach has always told me that if you get knocked down just take the time you need getting up and come back fighting twice as

He did just that, and as the fight wore on gradually got the better of his big-city rival - both mentally and physically.

Clearly frustrated in the closing moments of the bout, Cartey grabbed him in a headlock that sent both combatants to the floor and their respective corner men into the

ensuing melee.

From there, the two boxers unloading on each other in a fight-ending slugfest — but even that couldn't save Cartey from losing by unanimous decision.

Hart Jr.'s triumph came on the strength of a

well-executed jab as well as greater mobility over the three rounds.

"I used my speed and used my angles well. I broke his will. To get knocked down and come back and do that is pretty big. Not too many guys can do that."

Milton's only known active boxer continues to credit Bramalea Boxing Club coach Billy Martin - who under his tutelage, Hart Jr. has been a nearperfect 6-1 after a rather lacklustre stint with Hamilton's Regency Boxing Club.

"He's got me in tremendous shape, both mentally and physically," he said. "I'm just swarming with confidence these days."

Hart Jr. will look to win his fourth straight fight either later this month in Toronto or in early June in Mississauga.


Two names not included in article
