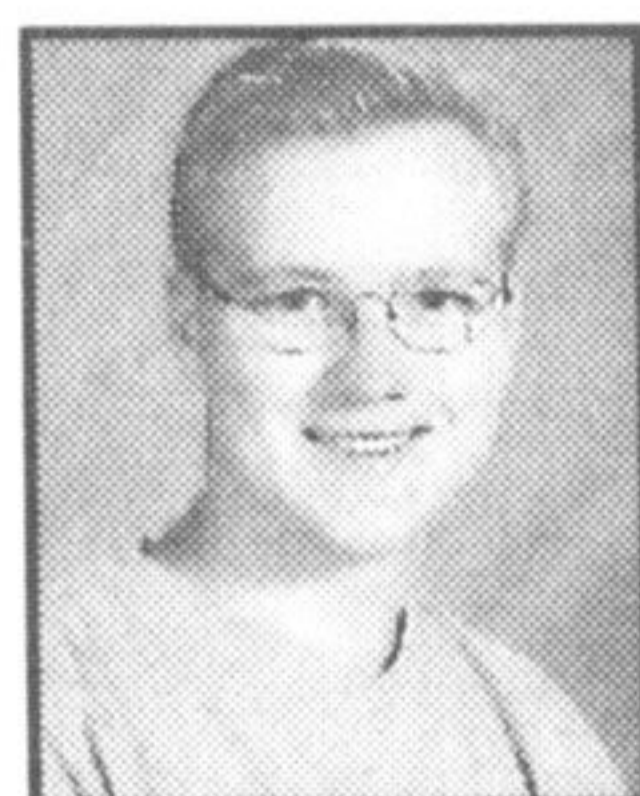
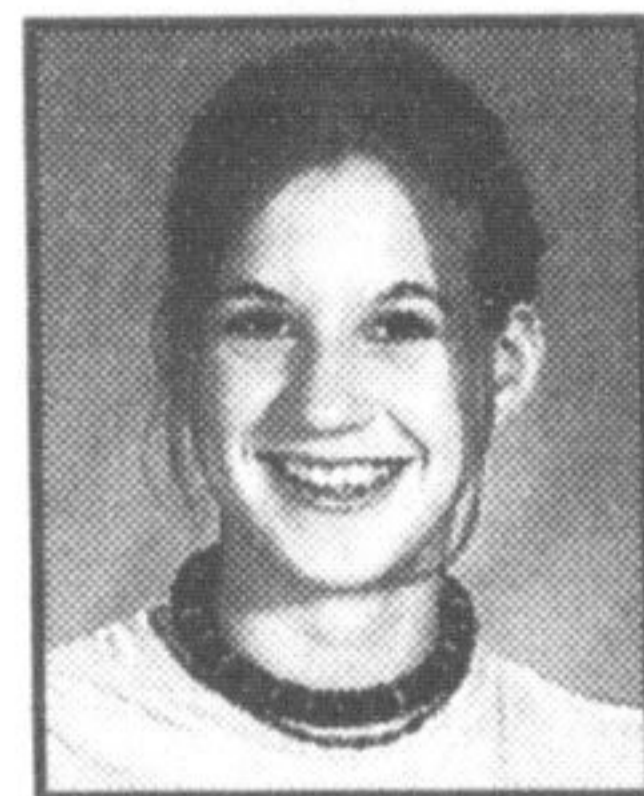

Yeah, well...having nothing left to say, we won't take any more time out of your weekend. Enjoy yourself, before the Monday moans kick in.

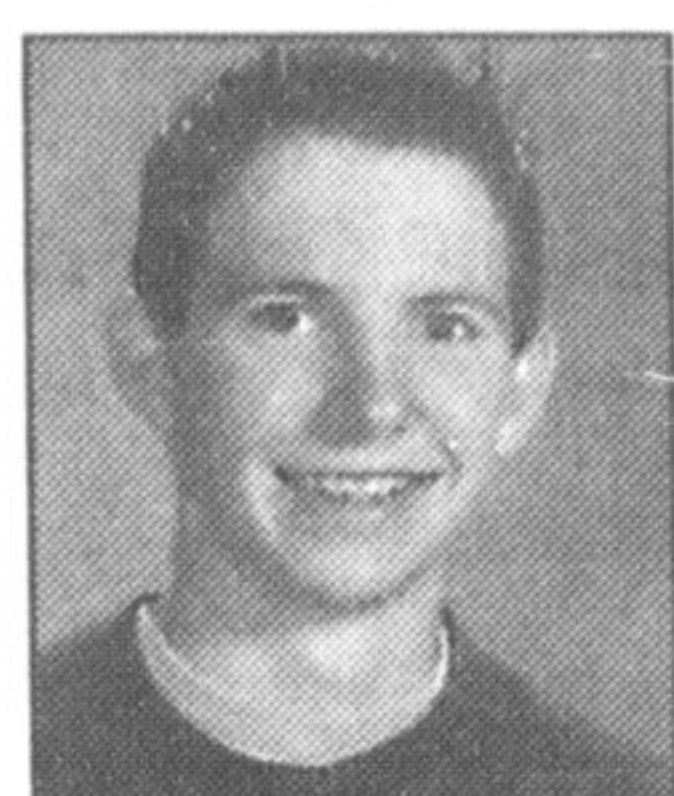
