McNeil given award for local heritage work

Leonard McNeil has a passion for local history.

That was made clear May 16 when the Miltonian was presented the Ontario Historical Society's Janet Carnochan Award at Hugh Foster Hall.

The award is presented annually to an individual who has contributed many years of service to the heritage community.

A teacher and historian, Ms Carnochan was the founder of the Niagara Historical Society in 1895 and was the driving force behind the establishment of the Niagara Historical Society Museum in 1907.


Mr. McNeil has been active in preserving Milton's history and was responsible for writing the Constitution for the Milton Historical Society. He also helped establish

Architectural town's Local Conservation Advisory Committee.

Also, he helped put up historical plaques at the P.L. Robertson Company plant on Bronte Street.

Mr. McNeil grew up in the Lindsay/Peterborough area before moving to Milton with his wife Helen in 1958. He had been a member of the Ontario Historical Society for several years and was also president of the Durham Country Club in Toronto. During his term, the club erected a plaque at Courtice in Durham County, commemorating the arrival of the parents of the Hon. Robert Baldwin in Bowmanville.

Mr. McNeil was also Milton's Citizen of the Year in 1986.



NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS WEED CONTROL

THE ONTARIO WEED CONTROL ACT AS IT APPLIES TO PERSONS IN POSSESSION OF LAND WITHIN THE TOWN OF HALTON HILLS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that unless noxious weeds are destroyed by June 10, 2002 and as often as is necessary throughout the season to prevent the ripening of their seeds and the dispersal of their pollens, the Town of Halton Hills may enter private property and destroy these weeds. The costs will be charged against the property owner and collected in the manner of municipal taxes.

For information of all property owners, the following are designated as noxious weeds in the Town of Halton Hills:

Bull Thistle Canada Thistle Colt's Foot Common Barberry Cypress Spurge Dodder European Buckthorn Goat's Beard Johnson Grass Knapweed Wild Carrot

Yellow Rocket

Nodding Thistle Poison Hemlock Poison Ivy Proso Millet, Black-seeded Ragweed Russian Thistle

Scotch Thistle Sow Thistle Tuberous Vetchling Leafy Spurge Milkweed

Complaints regarding dandelion and golden rod will not be accepted as these are not considered noxious weeds pursuant to the Weed Control Act.
