

Other successful people listen carefully to criticism and think about making changes to improve. When you think about it, though, non-successful people do the same thing.

want it and therefore I'm against it," he told The Champion. Policy revisions further propose bringing distance requirements in line with the Milton official plan — stating group homes must be at least 500 metres apart. The current policy distance is 300 metres.


The group home policy review was originally inspired by Victoria Street residents concerned about a then-proposed group home for troubled youth on their street.

Notification of the land purchaser's intent to construct a group home wasn't given until after the property sale was completed.

Reacting to the residents' concerns, a proposal to town council was made in November to restrict the location of group homes, requiring site-specific zoning amendments to permit the homes — which would require a public process.

But after hearing significant opposition from local group home operators, the issue was sent to Town staff to review and compare with other municipalities. It's from this work that the currently proposals are based.

Proposed group home policy revisions will be discussed June 10 during a public meeting at Town Hall at 7:30 p.m.


