At its May 23 meeting, CH's board of directors approved the hiring of consulting firm The Randolph Group to conduct an organization/operations/management

"The purpose of the review is not for cost-cutting or staff reduction," said CH CEO Theresa Maguire-Garber.

"With the growth we will need to increase costs and staff and we want to make sure we are well prepared for the future."


will cost \$22,500, around full-time staff and managers at the conservation site, additional resources for the future and areas needing work, she said.
