Bishop Reding student is one of three new school board trustees

The Halton Catholic District School Board has selected its three student trustees for the 2002-03 school year.

The appointments were announced at last month's board meeting, at which time they were introduced to the elected trustees from across the region.

Kristyna Opletal — currently a grade 10 student at Milton's Bishop Reding Secondary School, who will be enrolled in grade 11 at Christ the King Secondary School in Georgetown this September — will represent north Halton.

Martina Kunovic — a St. Ignatius of

Loyola Secondary School grade 11 student, who has maintained an A+ average throughout high school — will represent Oakville.

Jessie Hession — a grade 11 student at Assumption Secondary School, who is involved in all aspects of high school life — will represent Burlington.

As student trustees, they have the same rights as elected trustees to participate in both board and committee meetings, but don't have voting rights nor the right to be present at in camera board sessions. They will, however, represent the interests of the

approximately 25,000 students attending Halton's Catholic schools.

The three will replace Peter Debrone and Danielle Visschedyk, student trustees for the 2001-02 term.

Kristyna was a 2000 recipient of the board's Sharing the Spirit Student Award of Excellence and nominee for the Ontario Catholic School Trustees' Association Award, as well as a student rep on the Georgetown South Busing Delegation.

She was a volunteer on both the Student Liaison Team and the Selection Team for the new Christ the King Secondary School in Georgetown. A lector at Holy Cross Church and a delegate to World Youth Day this July, Kristyna is a mature and articulate public speaker who constantly displays exceptional leadership and interpersonal skills.

A recent decision by the board increased student representation from two members to three, a move that makes the Halton board the only such body in the GTA to have more than two student representatives.

The student reps were previously selected at large and for the past two years both have attended Burlington high schools. (During the two years prior to that, only one student was appointed and both times they hailed from Oakville.) The new system calls for reps to now be chosen from Halton's three major areas, namely Oakville, Burlington and north Halton.

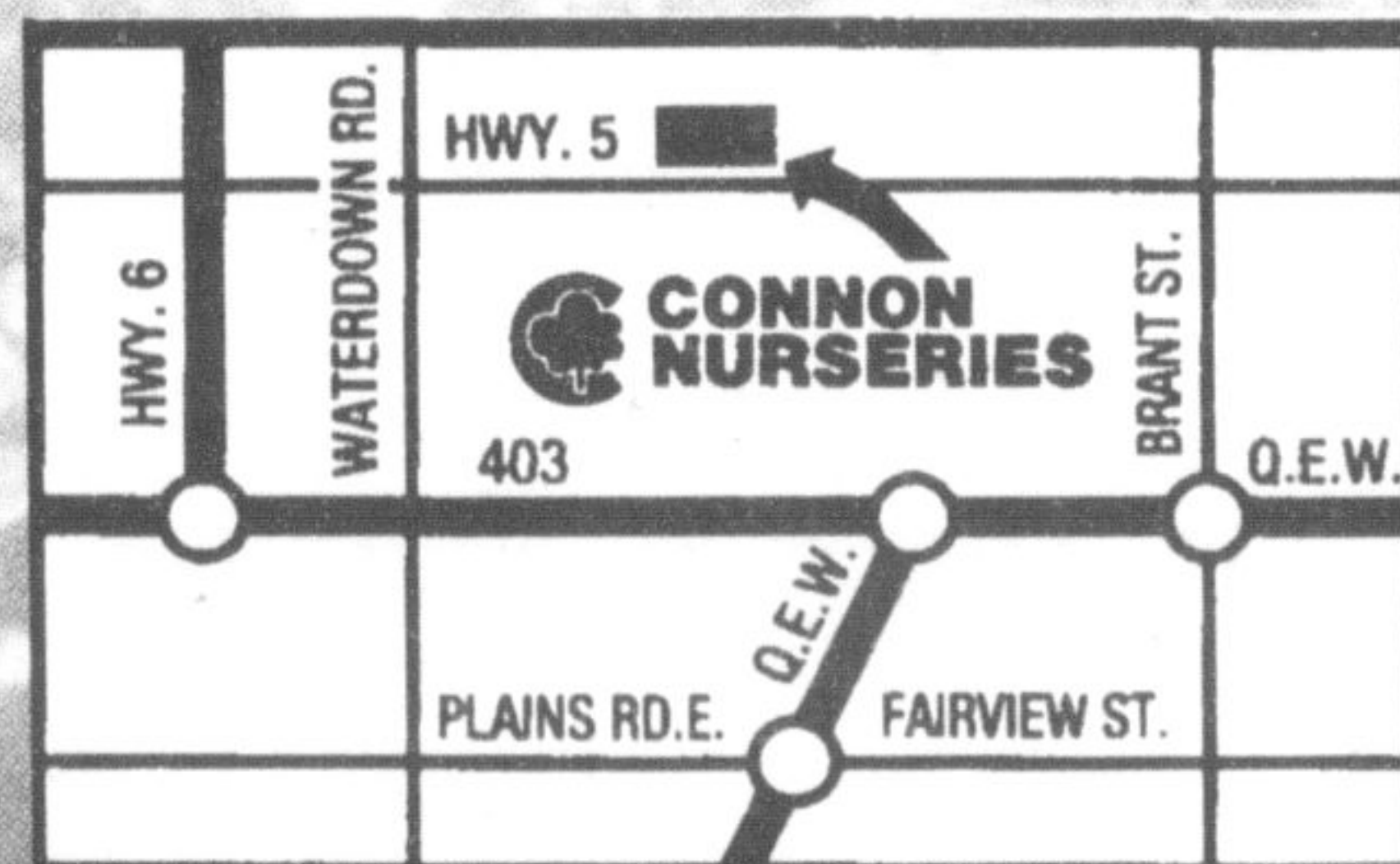
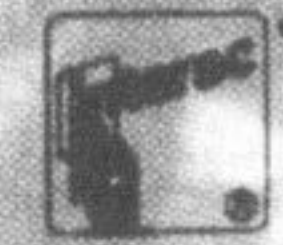

Town of Halton Hills is in the process of undertaking an Official Plan Review. An important aspect of the Review is to obtain input from the community on the land use planning policies that will manage change in the community for the next twenty years. These land use policies are being prepared to bring the Halton Hills Official Plan into conformity with the Provincial Policy Statement, the Region of Halton Official Plan and the Niagara Escarpment Plan. The Town is in the process of preparing a number of background studies on the commercial area, the rural area and the Silver Creek subwatershed.
