# Meeting to address Exxxotica's zoning request

The legal status of a controversial adult video store will be discussed during a public meeting July 9.

The Town will hold the meeting under the Planning Act to deal with a recent zoning amendment request by Exxxotica owner Tony Wang.

Details of the zoning amendment request hadn't been released at press time Friday.

"He is still intent on staying open," said Mel Iovio, the Town's director of planning and development. "If council approves the zoning amendment, then a bylaw amendment will then have to pass. If council turns down the request, Mr. Wang will have to appeal it to the Ontario Municipal Board."

The Town's solicitor and Mr. Wang's lawyer have been in negotiations for the past two months trying to come to a mutual agree-


ment about the Bronte Street video store establishment, which has been open since April 1.


Mr. Wang previously told The Champion he believes he's within his rights to open the video store because it's commerciallyzoned property.

But Town officials say zoning bylaws don't exist for this type of establishment, even though a Town bylaw exists for the licencing of such establishments.

Although Mr. Iovio agreed Exxxotica does fall under commercially-zoned property, Mr. Iovio said the Town considers it to be an adult entertainment establishment, which is prohibited.

The meeting is scheduled to begin at 7:30 p.m.



## West Nile may be in north Halton

Initial testing indicates the West Nile virus has found its way to Halton.

A dead bird discovered in Halton Hills last week has shown signs of the virus, but further testing at a Winnipeg laboratory is needed to confirm the Halton Region Health Department's find-


The West Nile virus is a mosquito-borne disease that's mostly non-threatening to humans. But people with a weakened immune system, the aged and very young can be seriously affected.

Symptoms are similar to the flu virus, but can cause death in extreme cases.

In order to reduce the chances of being bitten by mosquitoes, the health department recommends wearing light-coloured clothing with long sleeves and ensure opened windows are screened.

Use of a mosquito repellent containing DEET — with a concentration of no more than 30 per cent for adults and 10 per cent for children — is also recommended. DEET shouldn't be applied to infants. Residents should also drain any areas of standing or stagnant water and remove old tires as well as turn over pails, toys and wheelbarrows and change water in bird baths every few days.


