"I think they did a wonderful job, it looks great," the owner of A Catered Affair said, adding the restaurant did suffer a significant loss of sales during construction. "I'm somewhat impressed by the

size of the trees. We have a beautiful downtown. It looks really sharp."

Nanci Scriver, coowner of Cypress Intimate Apparel and Bridal Wear, said although she had hoped for more parking spaces, she's content with the new look of the street.

"I like the hanging plants and the posts. The sidewalks really needed replacing."

Like other Main Street businesses, sales at the specialty store were down for about two weeks, Ms Scriver added.

The re-construction of Main Street from James to Commercial streets began in March. The reconstruction saw the wastewater mains replaced and new servicing connections for the Main Street buildings. The last layer of asphalt was laid Tuesday and traffic lines were re-painted Wednesday, officially completing the re-construction project.


