

Drunk youth falls into creek; rushed to hospital

A 13-year-old Milton youth, who police say was intoxicated, was rushed to Milton District Hospital after he fell into Sixteen Mile Creek and loss consciousness last Friday.

Police and ambulance personnel were called to Laurier Avenue and Commercial Street at 6 p.m., where police say they found two intoxicated male youths.

After the teen was pulled from the water by his friend, he vomited and blacked out.

The unconscious youth was treated at Milton hospital and released later that night.

Charges are pending.

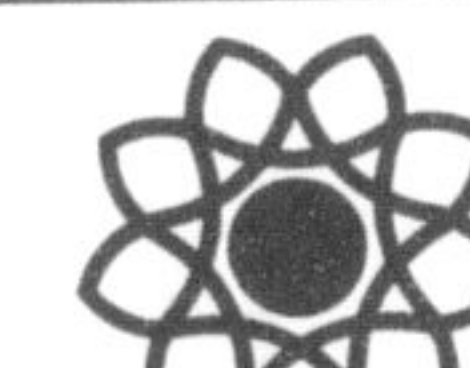
