She took pride in her horsemanship and wild upbringing on her family's dude ranch in the foothills of Alberta near Bragg Creek, choosing to downplay her more mundane Toronto roots. She schooled and owned horses from adolescence, acquiring her last horse, an Arabian stallion yearling, just before she became a senior citizen. Sally rode Hamish well into her eighties, performing dressage in a home-made ring her Campbellville neighbours helped her build. At various stages in her life she was an athletic youngster, air force wife, socialite and eccentric rural character. Her dearest companion and husband of forty years, Bob, predeceased her by 13 years. Together they traveled to remote locations including the Southwestern US, Ireland, Jamaica, Cuba, and Costa Rica, where he worked as a consulting geologist.
