"I'm going to Calgary until February to play a part in Footloose with Stage West out there. Then I'll come back."

That is, if she doesn't land another role in the meantime.

"I want to go to New York to audition. Toronto's great, but there's more to offer in New York."

While working, she makes sure to get nine hours of sleep every night and must keep her voice well rested.

"I drink a lot of water. I hold the high harmony throughout the show and I do a few solos. There's no holding back."

During downtime, Ms Truman said she pretty much stays close to home.

"I hang out here, my friends are here. Milton is home. I sleep here every night. I wish more Milton people would come out to the show."

November 15 with traditional favourites Rule Britannia, Greensleeves, Land of Hope and Glory, Danny Boy and Jerusalem.



Do you feel held back from living the life of your dreams? Do you want to learn how to ignore the negativity of your 'inner crit-


Milton's Carolyn Skelly will conduct the 10-week Creative Journal course beginning September 30.
