Construction firm gets nod to build new public schools

A construction firm has been selected for the building of public elementary schools in Milton and Georgetown next year.

Pre-Eng Contracting Ltd. of Concord, Ont. has been awarded contracts to put new schools on Woodward Avenue in Milton and Eaton Street in Georgetown by September, 2003.

Halton District School Board officials said Pre Eng was the low bidder for both projects. Trustees confirmed the contracts by 8-1 votes at a September 4 special board meeting.

Pre-Eng's most recent work for the Halton public board was building the newly-opened Florence Meares and West Oak JK-to-grade-8 facilities in Burlington and Oakville.

The planned Milton school will have capacity for 630 students. It will cost \$7.9 million, which includes \$390,000 for furniture and equipment and \$299,000 for the architect's fee.

The architect's charge will rise though if the school board goes ahead with a staff recommendation to reduce the size of the pending Millcroft 2 elementary school in

Burlington.

Milton 1 and Millcroft 2 are considered duplicate schools and design costs are usually lower when projects handled by the same firm have similar or identical designs.

However, if Millcroft 2 is downsized, as has been suggested by staff, architectural costs for it will go up as different plans would have to be rendered, board officials told trustees. How much costs will go up hasn't been specified.

The proposed Georgetown South school, rated for 655 pupils, has a price tag of \$8.05 million, which includes \$390,000 for furniture and equipment and \$421,000 in architect's fees. The latter amount, a 40 per cent increase over a different architectural firm's fees for Milton 1, prompted Burlington trustee Peggy Russell to ask staff why that fee is so high.

"A duplicate design does save some costs and we have incorporated it in some (past) cases," replied board facilities superintendent Gerry Cullen, the man responsible for monitoring construction projects.

"Georgetown (new school) is

long and narrow so it's not a duplicate (of Milton 1), so we had to use another architect.

"In my opinion this has been done in a very cost-effective way," he said.

Russell also questioned whether air conditioning, an expensive system to install and operate, was necessary in schools.

Oakville trustee and vice-chair Mary Chapin spoke in favour of air conditioning for Halton's new schools. "I know it is appreciated (by staff and students) in June and September" and during the summer months when schools are used by outside groups, said Ms Chapin.

Superintendent Cullen noted that in Ontario, to his knowledge, only the Peel District School Board isn't building new schools with air conditioning. The operations superintendent with the Peel public board said his board isn't putting air conditioning in new elementary schools but it's in its new high schools.
