Grant application projects must further the objectives of the Halton Region Strategic Plan, stimulate human service facilities for Halton residents (particularly children, youth, working poor, singles and sole support families) and fill gaps in community need and service provision.

All grant requests that meet the finalized criteria would be presented to regional council for consideration.

In addition to approving the program framework and goals, the committee also approved \$235,800 in funding for a quartet of non-profit housing initiatives — projects that would likely fall under the

program once it's operational.

Heading up the list of recipients is Milton Millennium Community Residences (Martindale Gardens), which received \$168,000.

Trafalgar Seniors Homes Limited (Woodside Mews) in Oakville was green-lighted for \$45,600 and the Halton chapter of Habitat for Humanity for \$8,400.

The final recipient was the Carpenter Hospice in Burlington, which is to receive \$13,800.

The hospice was originally proposed to be denied funding, but councillors decided it was in the better interest to get behind the project.

"Although this service (hospice care) is very valuable and worth-

while to the community... palliative heath care is not consistent with or connected to the regional mandate," the staff report stated in the recommendation to deny funding.

But Burlington Councillor Jack Dennison and the rest of the committee disagreed, amending the motion to include funding the organization.

"The whole community supports this project. This is the epitome of a community project that deserves funding," he said.

Regional council has yet to address the policy framework or individual grant requests. Council is expected to consider the issues Wednesday.
