THE STUDY:

The Ontario Ministry of Transportation (MTO) has retained URS Cole, Sherman & Associates Ltd. to prepare a Terms of Reference (ToR) to guide the future preparation of a Route Location/Concept Design Individual Environmental Assessment (EA) for the Mid-Peninsula Transportation Corridor.

The Mid-Peninsula Transportation Corridor has been identified as one of the key elements in the Transportation Development Strategy developed as part of the Niagara Peninsula Transportation Needs Assessment initiative. The first step in the EA process is the preparation of an Environmental Assessment Terms of Reference. Other elements identified in the needs assessment study (i.e. road widening, transit improvements, etc.) will be examined under separate initiatives.

THE PROCESS:

For an Individual EA, the Environmental Assessment Act requires that a proponent prepare a Terms of Reference (ToR) to define the scope of the proposed EA Study. The ToR requires approval by the Minister of Environment (MOE) and the subsequent Individual EA is then prepared in accordance with the approved ToR. The intention is to submit the ToR to MOEE for review in March 2003.

PUBLIC INFORMATION CENTRES:

In preparing the ToR, the Project Team will seek public input and comment via five rounds of Public Information Centres (PICs). The first and second rounds of Public Information Centres were held in July 2002/August 2002 to present the overall study process and the Draft Transportation Needs Assessment.

The third round of Public Information Centres (PIC) has now been arranged. The purpose of this round of PICs is to respond to comments raised at PIC#1 and PIC#2, report back on the analysis of additional roadway alternatives, present alternative EA Study Areas, provide an overview of EA Study Area conditions and constraints, and introduce the draft Route Planning EA Framework for public review and comment. This round of PICs will be held as follows:

Following the PICs, a set of workshops will be held. The primary purpose of the workshops is to obtain an understanding of stakeholder expectations on how route alternatives should be generated and evaluated during the subsequent Route Planning EA. Two more rounds of PICs and a round of public workshops will be held over the fall 2002 to winter 2003 period.

Comments and information regarding this project are being collected to assist the Ministry of Transportation in meeting the requirements of the Environmental Assessment Act. This material will be maintained on file for use during the project and may be included in project documentation. Information collected will be used in accordance with the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act. With the exception of personal information, all comments will become part of the public record.
