

Thieves take trailer of lumber

A trailer parked at Milton Heights Trucking Ltd. on Twiss Road was stolen overnight September 11.

About \$15,000 worth of lumber was stored inside the trailer.

WHICH OF YOUR CHILDREN DO YOU LOVE THE MOST?

In challenging times, when we are faced with struggle, adversity or pain - often, we can see God's loving presence clearer than at any other moment. Why? Because when we need Him most, He is there!

He responded gruffly, "Come off it now! It is psychologically impossible for anyone to

regard any three human beings exactly the same. If you're not willing to level with me, we'll have to terminate this session."

With this the young woman broke down, cried a bit, and said, "All right, I do not love all three of my children the same. When one of my three children is sick, I love that child more. When one of my three children is in pain, or lost, I love that child more. When one of my children is confused, I love that child more." Then she added, "Except for those exceptions I do love all three of my children about the same."

In her quest for guidance, she conveyed a powerful truth about Christian love. God knows us and loves us, personally and intimately, just as He knows and loves all other human beings on this planet - but when we are sick or hurting or

lost or confused or in pain or depraved - He loves us even more!

So, in our hour of desperation, we must look for God, recognizing that He will never leave us nor forsake us, and remember that it is in trying moments that we can sense that God loves us as if there were only one of us to love.

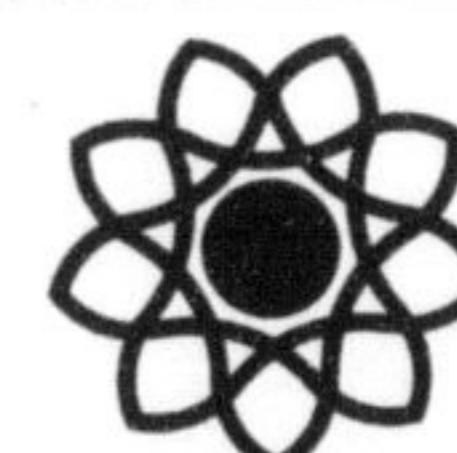
