

# Milton hospital welcomes own orthopaedic surgeon

Broken bones soon won't mean a trip to the Oakville hospital.

Starting Monday, Milton District Hospital (MDH) will have its first orthopaedic surgeon dedicated to the facility.

According to MDH Chief Operating Officer Cindy McDonell, the arrival of an orthopaedic surgeon in Milton really boils down to numbers.

"It was a question of at what point can your medical manpower plan be expanded to include a full-time orthopaedic surgeon. That's based on the town's growth," she explained.

Currently, those with bone, joint and muscle injuries must go to Oakville-Trafalgar Memorial Hospital or a surgeon from there must come to the Milton hospital for treatment.

But with the arrival of Dr. Markus Bischoff, that practice will become unnecessary.

"I'm really happy to be here. I think this is a great little hospital. They've treated me very well," the doctor told The Champion.

"I like that (being first dedicated orthopedic surgeon). That way I can set up the program the way I want to here in Milton, to help me work closely with the community. If you're the only one, you get more of a chance to work closely with the community."

Dr. Bischoff comes to Milton following medial training and residency at McMaster Medical Center in Hamilton and a sports medicine and orthopaedics fellowship in Banff, Alberta.

The surgeon will operate regular office hours during the week (8 a.m. to 5 p.m.) out of the hospital, as well as providing on-call services along with those from the Oakville hospital.

When it came time to locate himself somewhere, Dr. Bischoff said he selected Milton for two reasons; both



he and his wife have family nearby and Milton is a small hospital.

"I was looking for a smaller hospital. I like smaller hospitals better. It's a closer working environment. Milton was a logical pick," he explained.

"This is an area (orthopedics) that's expanding hugely and it (hospital) is definitely in need of an orthopedic surgeon."





Ratepayers of the Town of Milton are reminded that the second installment of the 2002 final billing is due on September 30, 2002.

If you require information about taxes, please contact the Corporate Services Tax Department at (905) 878-7252, ext. 2193, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday to Friday.

Tax payments must be received in the Corporate Services Office on or before the due date to avoid penalty. Late payment charge of 1 1/4% will be charged on the first day of default and on the first day of each calendar month in which the default continues.

It is the responsibility of the ratepayer to ensure that the taxes are paid by the due date, even in the event that the bill is not received as mailed.

### Taxes may be paid:

- a) By mail to the Corporate Services Tax Department, 43 Brown St., Milton, ON L9T 5H2 Cheques post-dated to the due date are acceptable and encouraged.
- b) Telephone or Internet banking (check with your financial institution for details).
- c) By using the mail deposit box to the left of the glass doors at Town Hall (all hours).
- d) Between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. at the Corporate Services Tax Department, Town Hall, 43 Brown Street, Milton. (Cheque or money order is preferred rather than cash) Direct Debit also accepted.
