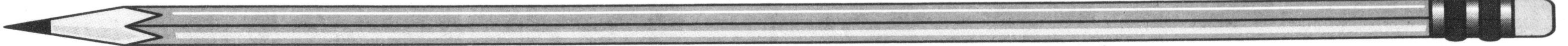

That's all for this week. Enjoy the weekend and rest up. There is sure to be more events to come (Not to mention homework).

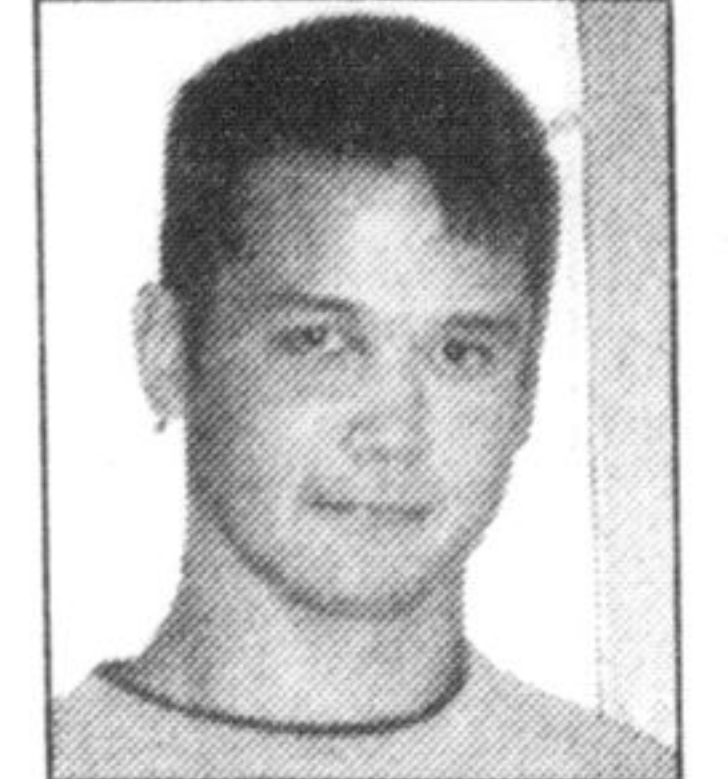

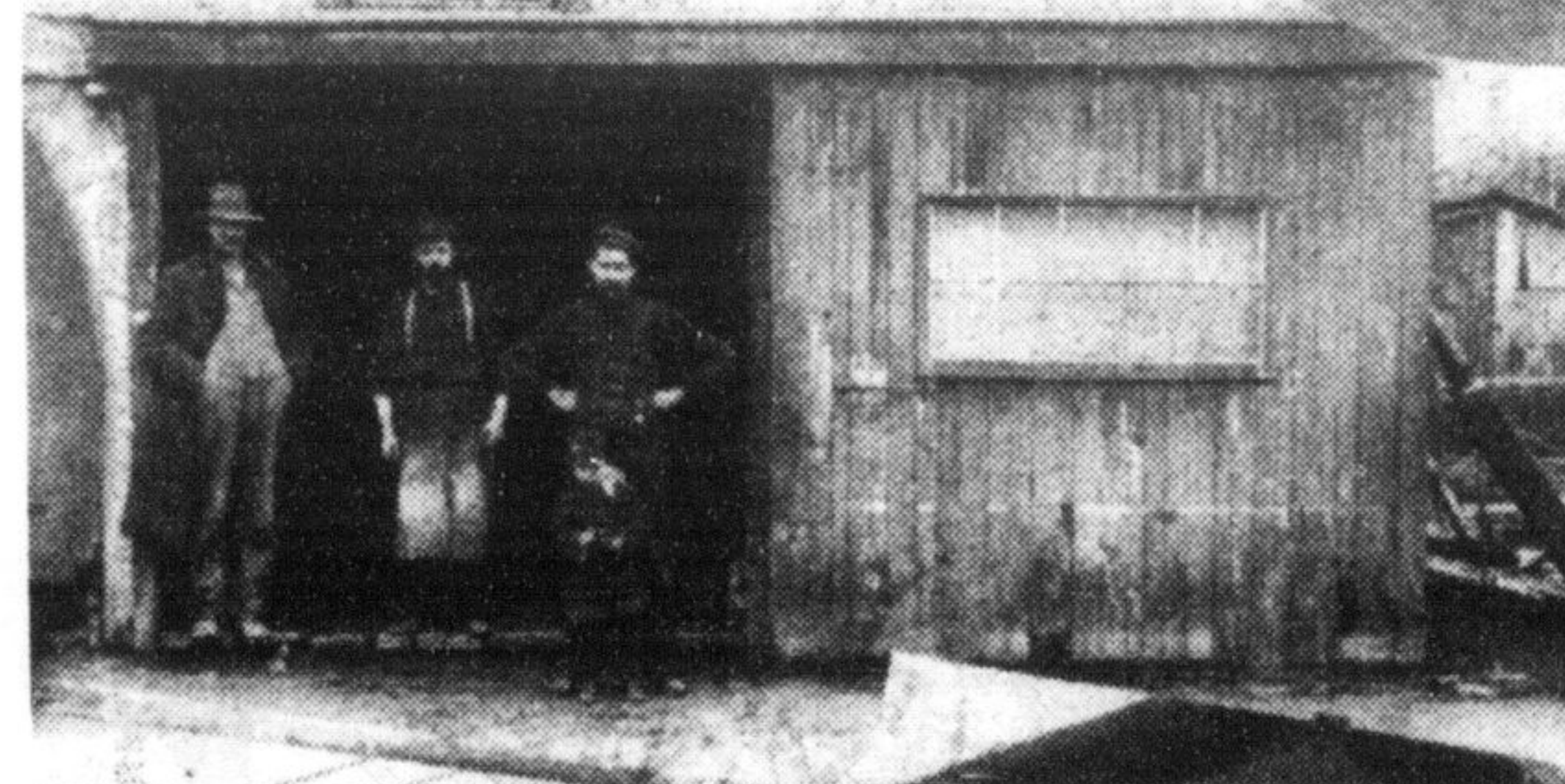
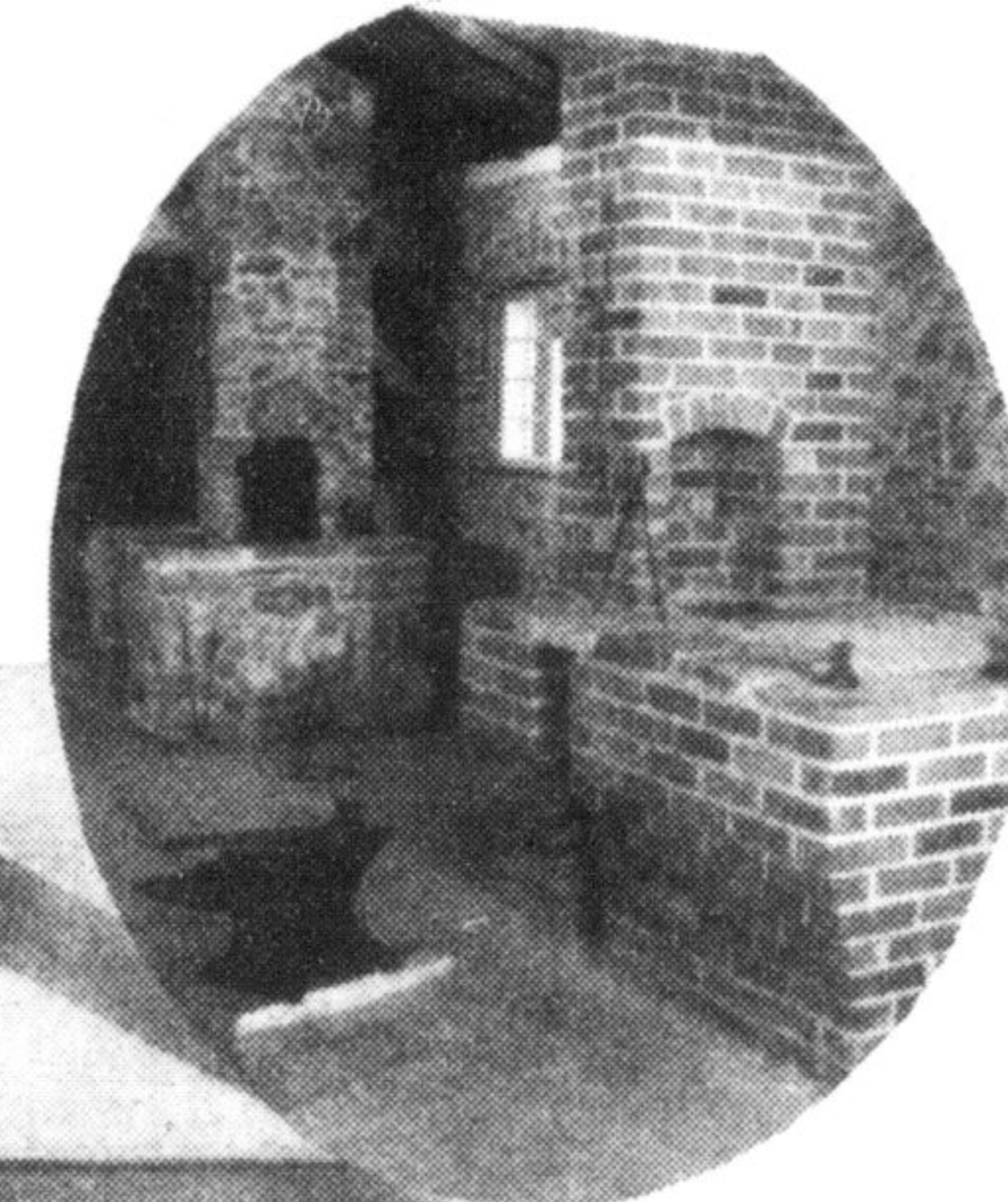
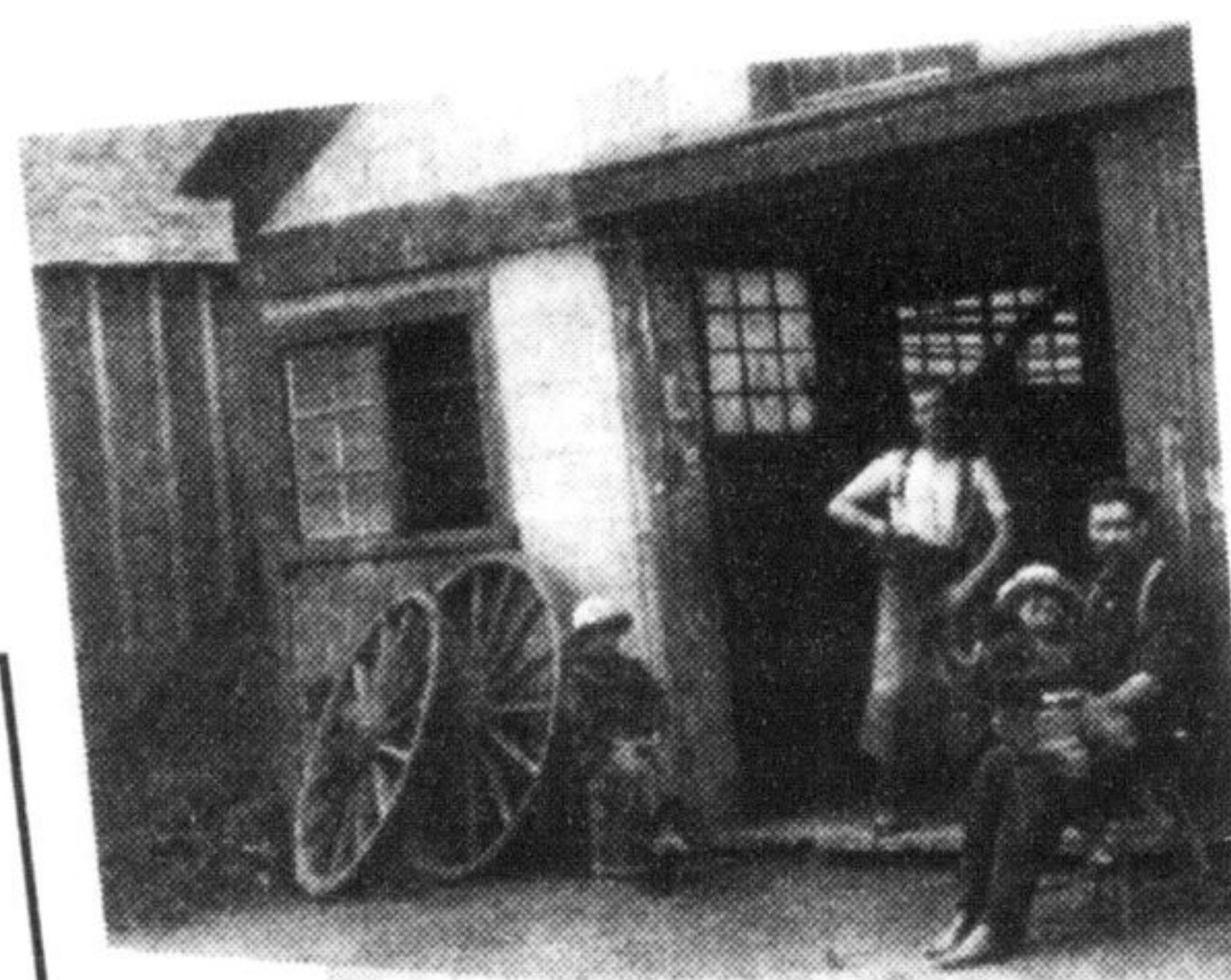
And so now we leave you with the promise that this school year is going to be full of new ideas and rich opportunities, and we are going to be right here all year long to give you our perspective on future memories in the making.
