


Annual fundraising ride to aid family of hit-and-run victim

Hundreds of cyclists are expected to ride through town Sunday during the second annual Jack Wierzbicki Memorial Tour De Milton.

More than 600 cyclists participated in last year's memorial ride, organized by Matt Burger of Spokes 'N' Slopes, and raised \$15,000 for Mr. Wierzbicki's family.

The ride will begin at the GO Station at 10 a.m. Registration will begin at 8:30 a.m.

The two routes — 40 km and 75 km — will travel through urban and rural Milton before returning

to the GO Station.

"The reason I wanted to have this memorial ride was because tragedy was right on our doorstep," Mr. Burger said, adding he's expecting 1,000 riders to partake in this year's ride. "He (Mr. Wierzbicki) was the bread winner of the family so we decided to help out financially. It was unbelievable, I couldn't believe 600 people showed up last year."

The cost to enter the memorial ride is \$20 per cyclist. The majority of the money will be put into three Canada Savings Bonds for Mr. Wierzbicki's children for post-

secondary education, Mr. Burger continued. The rest of the money will be used to promote cycling safety. "We're looking to do this (memorial ride) every year and hopefully each year it will grow."

Etobicoke cyclist Jacek (Jack) Wierzbicki, 41, was killed instantly August 14, 2001 by a hit-and-run driver on Tremaine Road, just north of Derry Road.

Brampton resident Paul Carroll, 30, pleaded guilty to careless driving causing death and failing to remain at the scene of an accident. He was sentenced to nine months in jail last month.

Emergency exercise is planned

In an effort to test the region's emergency plans, policies and procedures for responding to a multiple casualty incident, a mock emergency exercise will take place October 3 at Allendale.

The set-up, to be held in the parking lot from 9:45 to 11:45 a.m., will be conducted in real and full time and will involve Allendale staff (not residents), Milton Fire Department, Halton Regional Police, EMS, Halton Region Spills Response Team, Halton Regional Health Department and Halton Healthcare Services Group.

"Emergency preparedness is and always has been an integral part of our business," said Wayne Gould, Halton Region emergency planning co-ordinator.

"Conducting a mock emergency enables us to test the systems that are already in place to ensure that we are capable of handling any emergency that may arise."

Individuals wishing to gain access into Allendale that day may be asked to enter off of Childs Drive instead of the main entrance off Ontario Street.


