

Merchants unbeaten at Michigan tourney

The Merchants are no doubt hoping that last weekend's results prove to be a microcosm for the season at large.

Constant improvement is arguably the for the tournament opener. number one objective for any championship-minded team — and that's exactly what the local juniors delivered (albeit on a rather small scale) during their inaugural visit to the Compuware Fall Classic Tournament in Plymouth, Michigan.

there, they coughed up a pair of two-goal leads, the latter with less than three minutes remaining.
