## Semi-pro locals off to good start

Darren (Mini) Haydar marked his American Hockey League (AHL) debut with three assists to power the Milwaukee Admirals' 6-2 win over the San Antonio Rampage Saturday night.

Ingratiating himself to a home-opening crowd at the Bradley Centre, Milton's most prolific scorer set up goals one, two and six in the victory.

He finished the game a plus 2.

Among goals the Hobey Baker Award finalist assisted on was the first in 36 AHL games by resident tough guy Mitch Fritz.

Haydar's prosperous regular season start followed a strong exhibition campaign in which he had a handful of goals in three games — all ending in victory for Milwaukee.

The Admirals seem ready to improve on last year's meager twoand-a-half goals a game average, which essentially kept them out of the playoffs. They close out a two-game homestand tonight at the Cleveland Barons.

Milton fans will have an opportunity to see Haydar play close to home in early January, when Milwaukee has a two-game stand at Hamilton's Copps Collisium.

Meanwhile, fellow Miltonian Scott Bertoli had a productive regular season start in the semi-pro ranks as well.

The East Coast Hockey League (ECHL) veteran tallied twice in the first period last Friday to help his Trenton Titans knock off the Richmond Renegades 4-3. He also picked up an assist in Saturday's 3-2 loss to the Roanoke Express.

Trenton closed out a busy first weekend by toppling the Reading Royals 7-3 Sunday.
