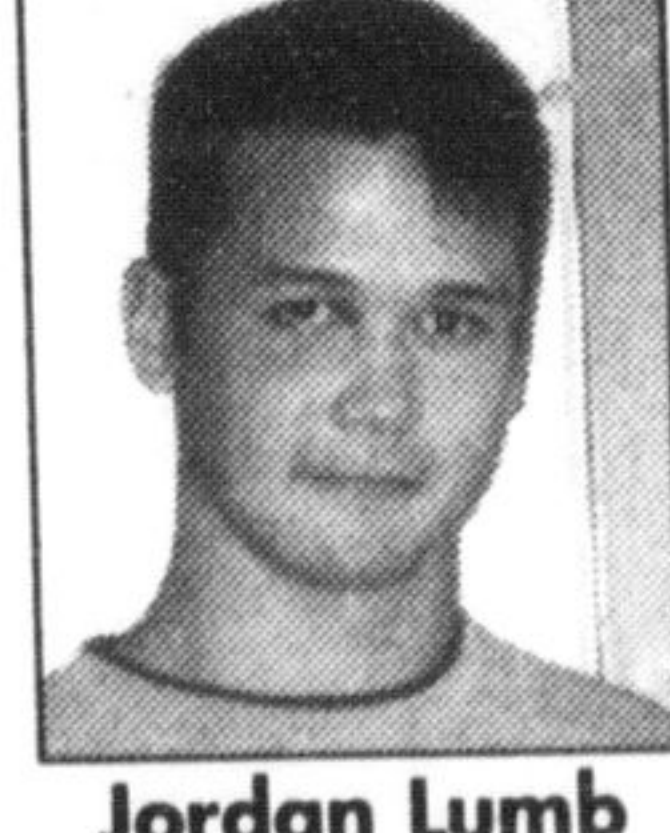
DATELINE DRURY

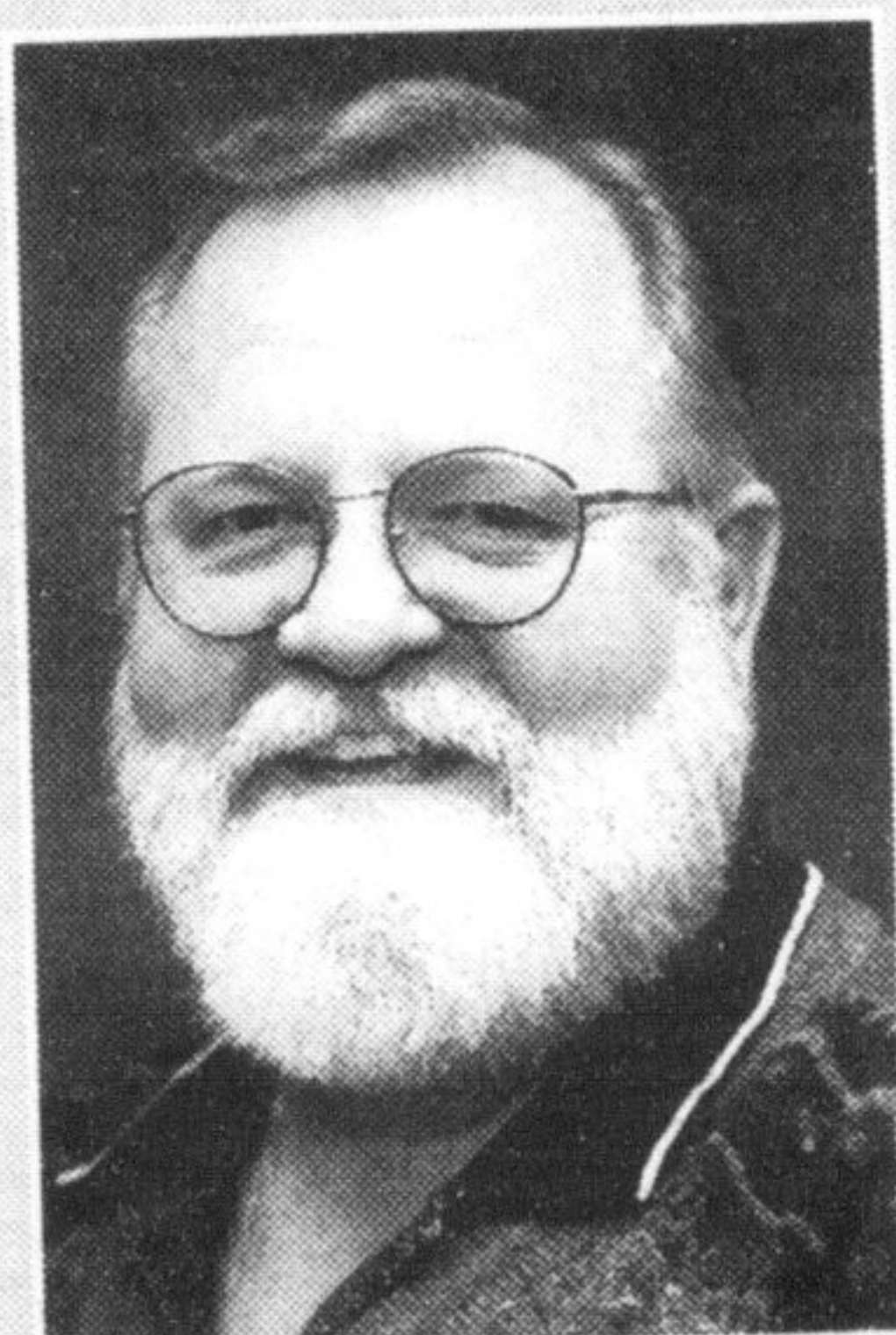
