A 31-year-old Milton man has been charged with trespass by night and breach of probation after a man was observed peeking into a Court Street residence October 2.

After an investigation by Halton Regional Police, the suspect was arrested October 16.

Indecent exposure

Halton Regional Police are looking for a 40-year-old male after a female youth reported that a man exposed himself to her Monday.

Trailers stolen

The Stoughton trailer was loaded with car parts valued at between \$60,000 and \$80,000.

The utility trailer was loaded with lamps and light bulbs valued at \$41,000.
