Baxter brothers meet Prince Philip after attaining gold status

Two Milton sea cadets received a royal handshake and personal congratulations from Prince Philip after attaining Gold Award status from the Duke of Edenburgh's Award 'Young Canadians Challenge' program.

Brothers Matthew and Adam Baxter received the awards from Prince Philip in Toronto October 10, as part of the Royal Visit.

The program requires participants to attain personally established goals in the areas of community service, skills development, physical fitness and expeditions.

The brothers are members of Milton's

Royal Canadian Sea Cadet Corps and have served as coxswain, the organization's highest non-commissioned appointment. Both have completed extensive leadership training in the cadet program, and have served as staff cadets at HMCS Ontario, the Royal Canadian Sea Cadet summer training centre in Kingston.

The brothers have received the Lord Strathcona Medal for exemplary leadership service and physical fitness. In 1999, Matthew received the Army, Navy and Air Force Veterans Association medal as the top cadet attending HMCS Ontario. Adam has been a recipient of the Royal Canadian Legion Cadet Medal of Excellence.

Matthew is currently attending the University of Guelph, where he plans to major in music. Adam is attending Brock University to study physical education.

"No child or young person is ever prepared for tragedy," said BFO executive director Wendy Dean. "Its impact can leave a devastating absence in the lives of surviving children, often leaving them traumatized and isolated. The funds provided through the UPS Foundation will be used to give bereaved children a place to

grieve and cope through the use of art, play and discussion."

The Children's Room will provide a comfortable, and neutral, environment where children can meet a professionallytrained counselor to ask questions and express fears without concern they're causing further pain to their families.

Founded in 1978 by four bereaved parents, BFO was originally established to provide healing and support to bereaved parents.

Programs are now also available to serve surviving children and youth.
