Mother warns teens to watch for signs of abuse

Many of the attendees at Halton's annual 'Victim-less' community policing conference wept quietly as anti-violence crusader Dawna Speers spoke of her daughter Monica's tragic death at the hands of an abusive ex-boyfriend.

On October 7, 1991, Monica was brutally murdered by her ex-boyfriend Adam.

Shortly after her daughter's death, Ms Speers joined the now defunct CAVEAT (Canadians Against Violence) and developed Monica's story "so that others would not walk in her footsteps."

Ms Speers was at the Oakville confer-

ence, presenting her educational package 'Choices for Positive Youth Relationships', which included a presentation of her award- winning film 'A Love that Kills'.

Her six-step curriculum based instructional guide was adopted in 2001 as a pilot project in 14 high schools in four provinces and her film is used as an educational tool across Canada, the United States and most recently Europe.

The educational program focuses on recognizing the signs of abuse.

"As I was writing Monica's story, I realized that there were signs along the way that Monica was becoming a victim," Ms Speers said. "He was chipping away, little by little, at her self-esteem until she wasn't her own person anymore."

Ms Speers discussed other signs like putting people down, playing on a weakness (Monica had a learning disability that Adam used against her on a regular basis), see YOUTH on page 31

Information About Yard Waste Collection

Effective September 2002, Halton Region phased out the collection of plastic yard waste bags as part of the yard waste collection program. Many communities in the GTA and across Canada have already implemented similar yard waste collection programs.

This change will help us improve the quality of the compost we are able to offer our residents, minimize plastic waste in the landfill and reduce costs. While plastic bags are relatively inexpensive and plentiful, they are costly to process and are not environmentally friendly.

We ask you to consider some alternatives to plastic yard waste bags:

Open reusable containers (such as an open garbage can or bushel basket) with a yard waste label

- Saves time because it is easier to fill
- Saves money by reducing the number of bags you use
- Saves the environment by reducing plastic waste

Biodegradable paper yard waste bags

- Sturdier than you might think, and will stand up through all kinds of weather
- Biodegradable and therefore will not contaminate the compost available to residents
- Easy to fill

Backyard Composting

- Leaves provide a rich component of carbon to the compost pile. A successful compost mix includes 75% carbon (brown material) and 25% nitrogen (green material)
