The privately-owned company was started in 1957 in the bodyshop of a St. Louis, Missouri car dealership and now has more than 220 locations across Canada.



wanted to go out and make a difference."


Ms Innes said she saw first hand how lonely the holidays can be for older persons who can't be with their families for Christmas.

"My mother was in Allendale last year around Christmas time. A lot of people didn't have anybody because life is to hectic. I wanted to bring a


little happiness."
