User fees to rise with inflation

Area residents can expect Town user fees and services to go up by an average of 2.7 per cent in January.

Milton's administration and planning committee approved the fee increases Monday.

"Staff has reviewed the latest consumer price indexes and has incorporated an adjustment to the majority of existing approved user fees," states a staff report presented to the committee.

"Some fees have been adjusted by an amount greater than the index to recognize market conditions or the current cost of the service."

Milton council hasn't adopted a position on user fee increases at this time, but is expected to address the issue Monday.

Operating costs coming in below budget

The Town of Milton is eyeing a \$112,486 surplus in the 2002 operating budget, as forecasted at this time.

According to a staff report presented to

Council briefs

the Milton administration and planning committee Monday, the surplus is, in part, the result of a delay in hiring for the 'help desk', collected revenues that were uncounted and an increase in program revenues.

Council will address the surplus during budget discussions later this year.

GO Transit to open new layover station

GO Transit is looking to construct a new layover station in Milton, north of the CP Rail tracks, east of James Snow Parkway and west of Fifth Line.

Milton's administration and planning committee endorsed the proposal 'in principle' Monday, providing GO meets all Town planning requirements and agrees to mitigating measures.

Any mitigating factors are expected to be

identified during an environmental assessment — which is to be conducted prior to construction.

If ultimately approved by town council and the Ministry of the Environment, the station would be used to house train cars overnight.

Town council is expected to address the "in-principle" approval Monday.




