NATIVITY PAGEANT LETS VISITORS EXPERIENCE THAT FIRST CHRISTMAS

While Christian churches throughout the world will be re-enacting the birth of Jesus this Christmas season, seventeen Milton and area churches have banded together to create a Nativity pageant unlike most others. Not only does this pageant take place out of doors but it also allows the visitor to get involved in the produc-

"As participants walk from scene to scene, they will experience what it was like to travel the road to Bethlehem to be counted in the census two thousand years ago," comments Heather Auger, treasurer of Milton's Christian Churches Working Together, the major sponsor of the pageant. "Visitors will be able to interact with the performers - the wise men, the shepherds, the Roman soldiers. They will be able to rejoice with the angels and the little drummer boy at the manger where a real baby will play the part of Jesus. And along the way, they'll meet lots of real animals including llamas, donkeys, sheep being tended by a real sheep dog, goats, cows and even a camel."

As Andrea Rowbottom, creator and director of the pageant

explains, "We want this production to be as realistic as possible. Country Heritage Park provides the ideal setting with its heritage buildings, walking paths and farm animals. Together with the wonderful work our costume and prop people have done, we hope visitors will truly experience the real meaning of Christmas."

The pageant has become a major community event involving not only town churches but also congregations from Halton Hills to Brookville. More than 250 volunteers have been working for months to put the production together and the cast now numbers over eighty.

Adds Henry Hildebrand, who is involved with fundraising for the project, "We are amazed by the enthusiastic support we have received. Local farmers are providing additional animals for the various scenes, local businesses and individuals are providing goods and services as well as financial support. Hillcrest United Church on Trafalgar Road is promoting the pageant through their float in the Milton Santa Claus parade while New Life Church is providing a bus service between town and Country Heritage Park.

Everyone is chipping in to help make this project a huge success."

'On the Way to Bethlehem' runs from December 6th through December 9th from 6:30pm to 8:30 pm at Country Heritage Park, 8560 Tremaine Road, Milton (off Hwy 401, just west of Milton.) 
