Photocopying not student volunteer work: ministry

High school students photocopying papers for teachers as part of their mandatory community service in order to graduate violates the spirit of the provincial legislation, says a Ministry of Education spokesperson.

Dave Ross, senior media relations co-ordinator for the ministry, said he doesn't believe photocopying is the kind of activity the Ontario government had in mind when it passed a regulation three years ago requiring high school students to perform a minimum 40 hours of volunteer work as a prerequisite to graduating.

Current grade 12s in Ontario are the first wave of students who must have at least 40 hours community service to graduate.

"Community involvement is a very specific responsibility. They provide expanded opportunities for learning. It (photocopying) doesn't follow the spirit of the intent," he said.

The ministry employee was reacting to news that some students at at least one Halton high school — Nelson in Burlington — are gaining credit for photocopying papers for teachers.

A passage on the Ministry of Education's Web site states: "The purpose of the community involvement requirement is to encourage students to develop awareness and understanding of civic responsibility and of the role they can play and the contributions they can make in supporting and strengthening their communities."

Mr. Ross did note though that "boards and principals have the ultimate authority" in terms

of deciding what's an appropriate community service task.

David Waugh, a Grade 11 student at Nelson and one of two student trustees with the Halton public school board, said he knows some students at his school are being allowed to photocopy for teachers and getting volunteer credit for

"They are photocopying for the teachers and the teachers are signing them (student volunteer passports)."

The education ministry has a list of 13 circumstances on its Web site that are considered ineligible volunteer activities, but photocopying isn't specifically mentioned.

The Halton board's superintendent of education (programs), Barry Finlay, said he wasn't in agreement with students photocopying as a community service, but, like Mr. Ross, he also deferred the final decision to principals.

Nelson principal Bev Miller said she's aware of the photocopying by some of her students and believes it's a legitimate volunteer service.

"One of our teachers, about a year ago, realized that with the new (provincial) curriculum there was a large volume of paperwork so she proposed a group of students use the photocopying room in order to help out the students with their (volunteer) hours and help teachers at the same time," said Ms Miller.

"The students don't do it on class time. The majority of our students are doing things like teaching Sunday School and helping out at retirement homes."


