he members of Infulltrate have only been together six months, but already they're committed to making it together in the music indus-

The band, made up of Milton District High School students Andrew Dempster, Shawn Lovering and Steve Miller and E.C. Drury High School students Eric Helliwell and Joel Lazarski said they're serious about pursuing careers in one of the toughest businesses in the world today.

But if last Friday's show at Southside Community Church is any indication of how the band will fare in front of an audience, the teens have nothing to fear.

"It was our first major show," said Shawn, Infulltrate's vocalist. "Before that we just played for friends. We had amazing feedback."

Infulltrate performed 12 original songs during their one- hour-and-15-minute set and have also recorded a live CD, which they hope to have ready for distribution

"After the first song I just fed off the crowd," Shawn said, adding the band's sound is a combination of rap, metal and hard rock.

The band agreed they were feeling the sting of performing their first "real" show.

"I was nervous the first two minutes on stage, but we had a lot of support from our friends," added drummer Eric.

we had to stop playing. People were coming up to us asking when our next show

The guys knew each other prior to forming the band, Shawn said, which made the decision to form a unit that much easier.

"We knew we were all talented and could put together a band."

Next week, Infulltrate will launch their own Web site, www.infulltrate.com, which will feature pictures, a biography of the band, contact information and show dates.

"We're playing in March at E.C. Drury and we might be playing in the Ukraine in April for a festival," Shawn said.

"Because we've had a show and people have heard our sound, we want to spend more time getting out there. We want to connect with our fans and spread around our music. We're serious about this and the Web site will help promote the band."

The band members, who say their musical influences are Rage Against the Machine, POD and Creed, said they plan to release a studio album sometime in the near future.

"We want to spread a message of hope instead of killing and selling drugs," Eric added.
