Town may provide grants for restoration projects

Property owners in downtown Milton and other heritage sites may get a helping hand from the Town should they undertake restoration projects.

Milton council endorsed a motion last week that would see Town staff include the consideration of financial incentives for heritage property owners as part of the official plan five-year review — set to begin next year.

"I think this is encouraging. In terms of commercial development, our strategy is to create a strong downtown core. If that's your strategy, you have to be prepared to invest in several ways," said Councillor John Challinor, who also chairs Heritage Milton (formerly known as the Local Architectural Conservation

Advisory Committee). It (restoration projects) helps to create a vibrant downtown core. It attracts better merchants. It attracts consumers."

Provincial legislation allows municipalities to offer financial assistance to property owners looking to undertake restoration projects provided the Town has an 'Community approved Involvement Plan'.

Milton currently has no such

plan. As part of the five-year official plan review, Town staff will consider the creation of such a plan, what would be included in the plan, as well as a range of financial incentives available to the Town.

"These reviews (official plan, parking policy and standards study), may establish a policy basis and lay the groundwork for downtown revitalization," states a Town staff report on the issue.

"In addition, given the recent streetscape improvements completed on Main Street, it would also be beneficial for staff to continue to monitor development progress and property improvements in the Central Business District, as indicators such as storefront vacancies and building conditions are integral to determining downtown revitalization priorities."
