

Municipal council election nominations now open

Nominations are open — the time is coming to choose your next municipal council.

In order to run in the November 10 election — be it for town councillor, regional councillor or mayor — candidates must reside or own land in

Milton, be at least 18 years old, a Canadian citizen and not in prison. There's a \$100 fee to run for council, though the money will be refunded if the individual collects at least 2 per cent of the vote.

The fee to run for mayor has been set at \$200, with the same rules for a refund.

Nominations close September 26, giving candidates at least 45 days of campaigning time.

For more information, contact the clerk's

office at Town Hall. At present, town councillors receive an annual stipend of \$19,039 and the mayor receives \$44,340. Regional councillors, who also sit on town council, receive a further stipend of \$21,700 from Halton Region.

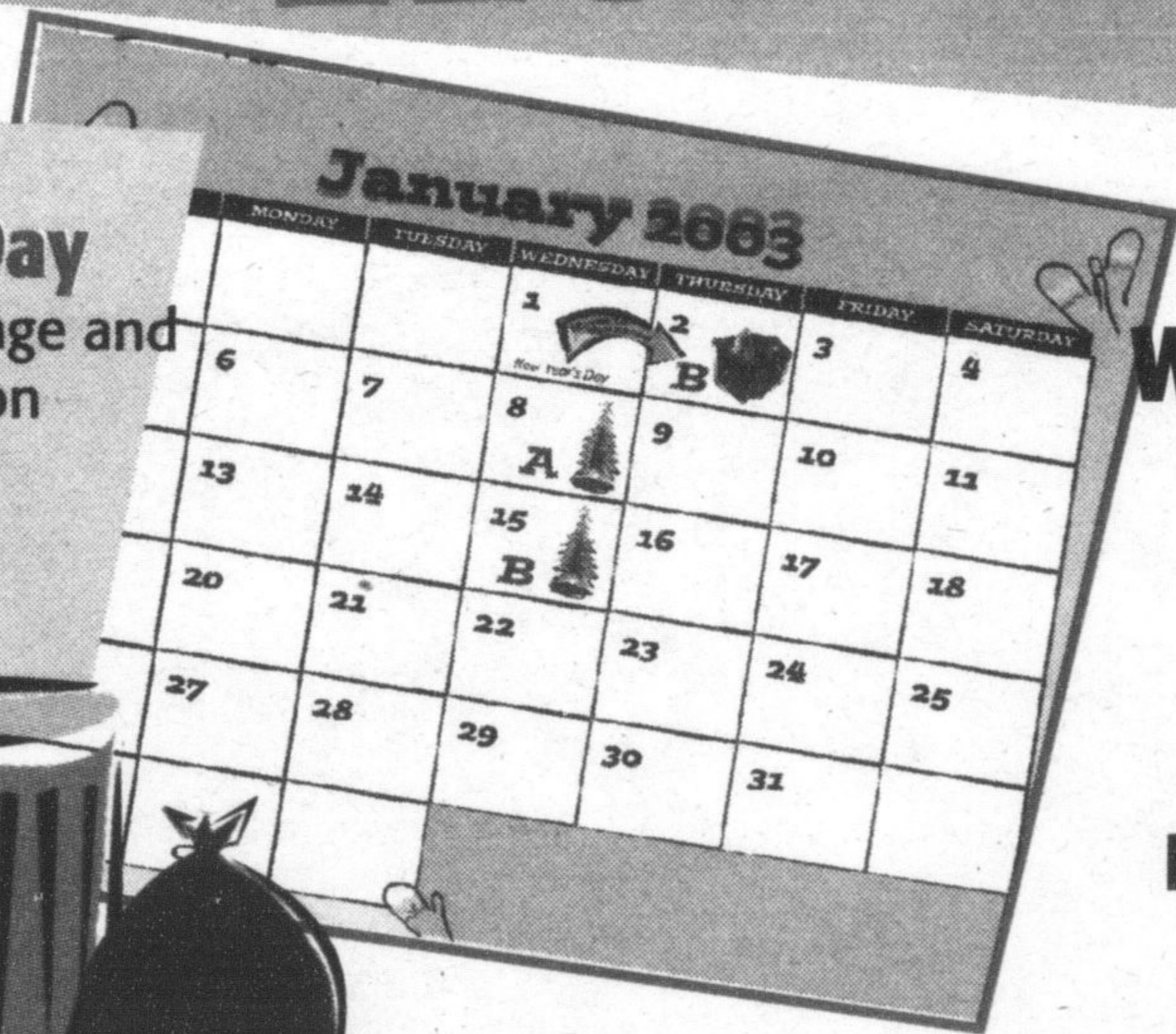
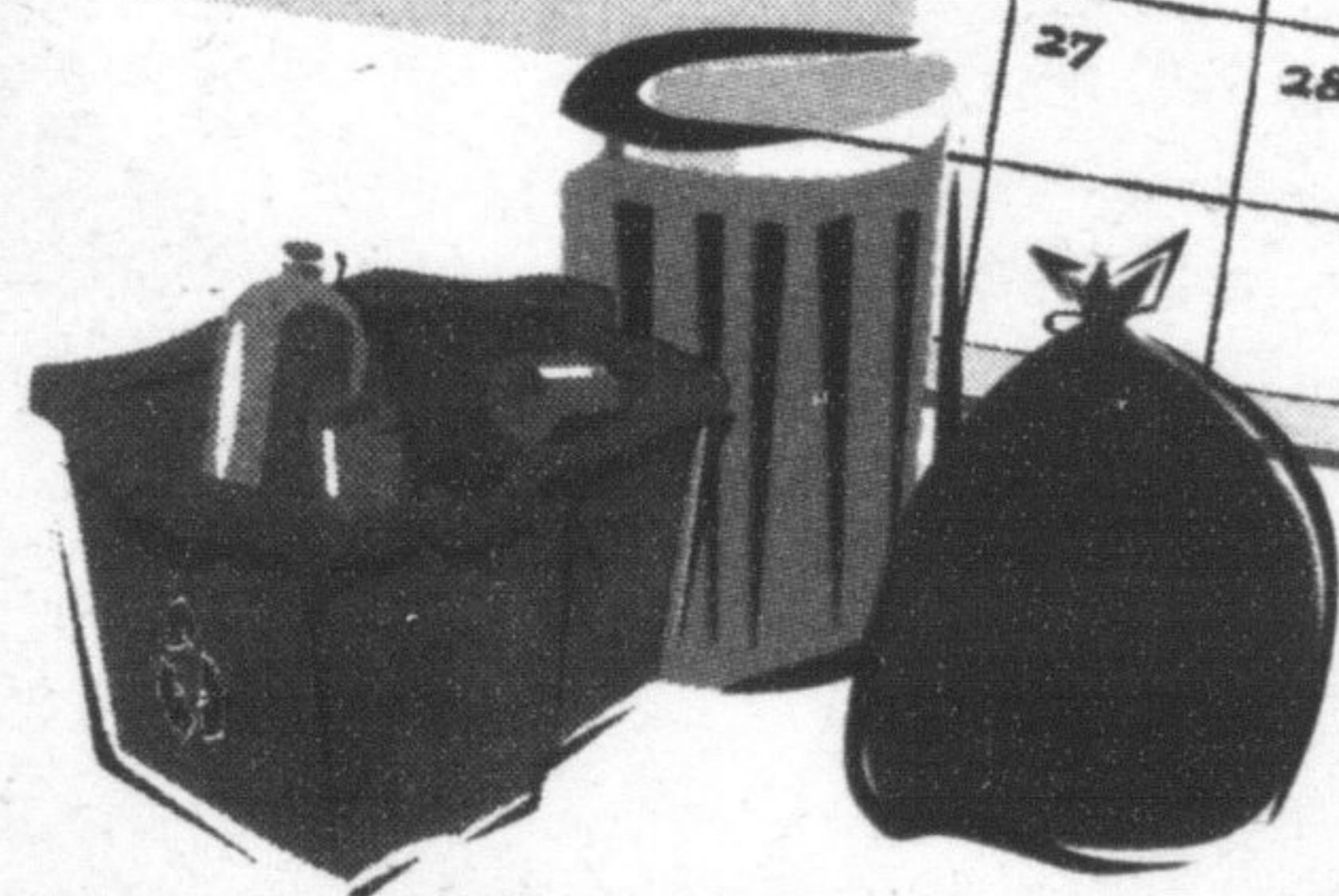

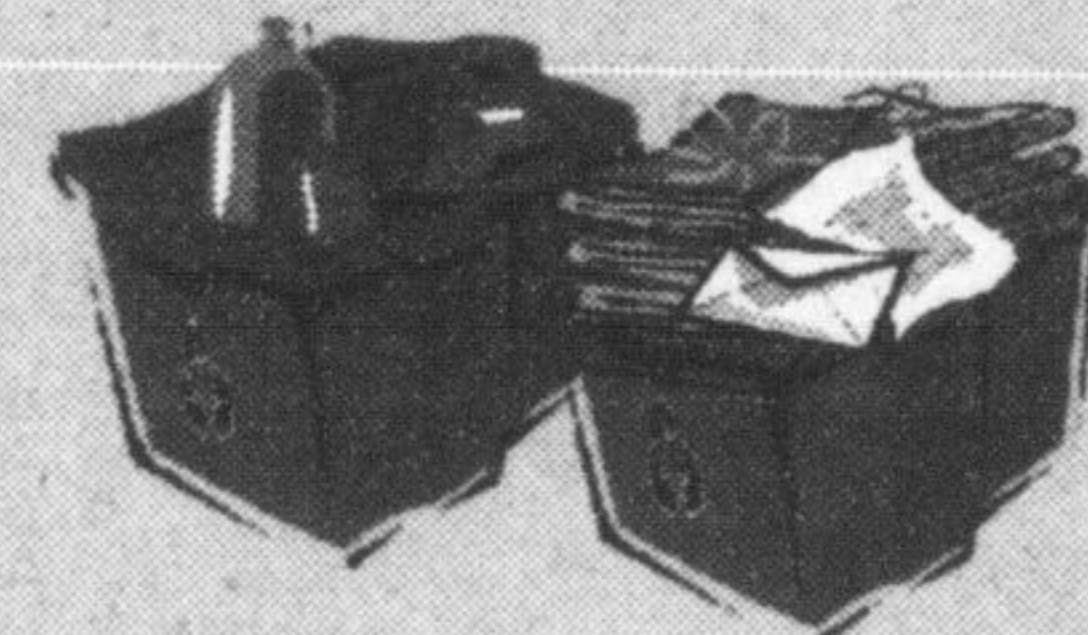
