Report author says some cancers caused by poor lifestyle choices

men are prostate (25.6 per cent), followed by lung (14.6 per cent) and colorectal (12.8 per cent). In women, the leading cancers are breast (31.7 per cent), followed by colorectal (11.4 per cent) and lung (10.4 per cent).

The Region used data from Cancer Care Ontario in its report.

Mr. Delmore stressed some cancers are caused by poor lifestyle choices. For example, he said the chances of getting lung or pancreatic cancer could be reduced by eliminating smoking.

This is important to point out, Mr. Delmore said, because of the results of a survey conducted by York University.

Commissioned on behalf of Ontario's 21 public health departments, including Halton Region, the university surveyed more than 2,000 people 18 years of age and older between January 2001 and August 2002 to gauge what they thought were the causes of various cancers. Information was collected for each individual public health depart-

Most respondents said tobacco was

the number one cause of cancer, followed by family history and environmental pollution.

Mr. Delmore said extensive research shows tobacco is the leading cause of cancer. And while it was encouraging most respondents agreed it was the biggest cause, the discouraging part is they represented less than half of those surveyed.

Also, research shows diet and obesity are actually second among cancer causes. Family history and pollution are further down the list.
