

Stepfather, son facing charges in arena fight

A boy and his stepfather have been charged with assault after a fight broke out at John Tonelli Sports Centre Sunday at about 11 p.m.

Halton Regional Police said a 15-year-old boy was watching a hockey game when he was approached by a youth who wanted to fight him.

Police said the victim declined, but was later confronted by the boy in the parking lot. The boy struck the victim in the nose and a fight broke out.

Then a man approached the pair and joined in on the skirmish, police said.

Charged with assault is a 15-year-old boy and 30-year-old man, both of Milton.

Break and enter

Halton Regional Police are investigating four break-ins at the same subdivision that left several new homes at Third Line and Derry Road without furnaces.

Sometime overnight February 18, thieves entered the secluded residential development and went to four different houses, each having a new furnace chained to a post in the basement. They proceeded to smash down the poles with a large tool. They then removed each of the four furnaces from the basements with the chains
