Halton Regional Police are investigating the theft of an ATV from a Milton residence.

Sometime overnight February 27, thieves broke into the rear shed of a house on Main Street West.

They gained entry by cutting the lock with a large power tool.

Once inside, they stole a red 2000 Honda TRX300 all terrain vehicle.

The total loss is estimated at more than \$3,500.

House break-in attempted

A 23-year-old Kitchener man was charged with public intoxication.


Stranger peeks in window




