## Superchoice set to close for good this Sunday

Milton's last large-scale independent grocery store plans to scan its final product by 6 p.m. Sunday, putting 50 full-time and part-time people officially out of work.

Superchoice Country Markets manager Joe Luis told The Champion the store has discounted all of its merchandise - except cigarettes — by 10 per cent.

He said there's a slight possibility the store could stay open a couple of days beyond Sunday if a lot of merchandise is left unsold. Discounts at that point would be between 30 and 40 per cent.

A family-owned grocery store revered for its fresh produce, Superchoice, owned by Shaker Rooplal, announced last month that it would be closing its doors.

Employees are upset at losing the friendships they've made over the years with loyal customers.

Liz Jagoda is a produce clerk and has worked at the store for 12 years. While she hasn't found another job, she hates the thought of not seeing familiar faces every-

She said customers have been very understanding, bringing her 'good luck' cards, flowers and giving her phone numbers to meet for coffee.

"Because our customers are our friends, we're going to miss them as much as they're going to miss us," Ms Jagoda said while busily stacking tomatoes last Friday.

Clement Zinally, a four-year produce clerk, said customers have been so supportive since the store's closure was announced last month.

"The customers are just amazing people," he said, while washing romaine lettuce. "They're very courteous and very concerned for us about what kind of jobs we will have in the future."

Mr. Zinally said he doesn't have another job lined up and is considering going back to school. He has a sociology degree from York University.

Milton is left with two primary grocery stores, Loblaws on Nipissing Road and A&P at Laurier Avenue and Ontario Street South.

It's the second independently-owned grocery store to close in town in mere months. Quality Greens — a well-thought of business, particularly because it offered home delivery to seniors - closed its Main Street doors in November.

Superchoice has been open at the corner of Derry Road and Ontario Street, since 1982.

Shoppers have expressed concern there's no discount grocery store in town that caters to lower-income families.
