Discovering Your Celtic Soul

More than 1500 years ago, a balding middle-aged monk named Patrick landed on the shores of Ireland with a passionate message of love and reconciliation. That message ignited a nation. Now millions of people the world over celebrate St. Patrick's Day in celebration of his life.

Legend speaks of Patrick teaching the Irish people the doctrine of the Trinity with a 3-leaf clover. He showed them a gracious God who is three persons, and at the same time one. A triune God of grace. So what did that mean to the Irish, and what does it mean to us?

Well first, it means that God—the Father, Son and Holy Spirit have lived together throughout all time in eternal relationship. The Trinity has enjoyed intimacy, joy, love and fellowship in the closest of relationships forever. Athanasius, a third century theologian credited with saving the Christian faith, called this relationship the perichoresis—which means the Great Dance. The relationship of the Father, Son and Spirit is one of eternal celebration, dancing, laughter, joy and deepest love.

Also, it means that we are invited into that "Great Dance" relation-

ship. When God the Son became human his purpose was to invite all of humanity into the circle of life enjoyed by the Trinity. Through his life, death and resurrection, Jesus personally invited and included us in the Great Dance. God's #1 plan for us has always been to enjoy eternal fellowship, intimacy and love with Him. The ancient Celts embraced this love with a passion only the Irish could do. It is no wonder that for 1200 years they have been singing a hymn called the "Lord of the Dance."

Is this the kind of God you are looking for? This kind of stuff changes people forever. Once you join the "Dance", nothing remains the same. It changes individuals, families and even whole cultures. It did in Ireland and it can for you too.

Have you discovered your Celtic soul? Check out one of Milton's great churches this weekend. Find exactly what you are looking for, what you were made for. Enjoy a life of love with God and one another.
