

## Curb Appeal Oakville Special Notice Oakville Special Collection

Due to the poor weather conditions on April 5, some residents may not have been able to place their special bulk waste out for collection.

Halton Region will revisit Zones 1 and 2 in Oakville on Saturday, April 26.

If you are in Zone 1 or 2 and you have not already received bulk collection please place your material out no later than 7:00 am on Saturday, April 26.

The following materials will NOT be collected:

- Propane Tanks
- Tires\*
- Building and Demolition Debris
- Concrete and Bricks
- Household Hazardous Waste
- Cardboard Boxes
- Tree Branches
- Tree Stumps
- Soil and Rocks
- Automobile Parts

\*Old tires filled with water can be mosquito breeding sites.
Take advantage of Halton's Tire Amnesty– Saturday, April
26 at the Halton Waste Management Site.

Cardboard boxes are recyclable. Please place them curbside with your Blue Box, bundled 30" x 30" x 8"

Household Hazardous Waste & Propane Tanks may be disposed for FREE at the Halton Waste Management Site

Important Information

- Remove doors from appliances for safety
- Do not pile items on top of one another
- Bundle loose materials such as wood, in lengths no longer than 4ft. (3 bundles maximum)
- Keep metal items separate from other material Metal items, including appliances are collected by a different vehicle
