A 25-year-old Georgetown man was charged with being intoxicated in a public place.

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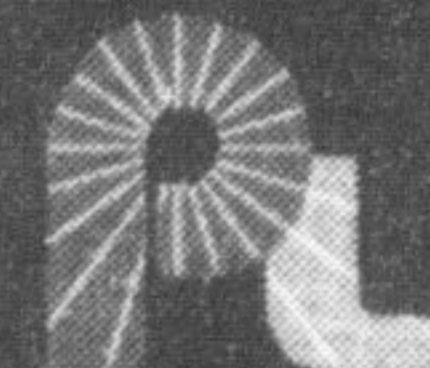

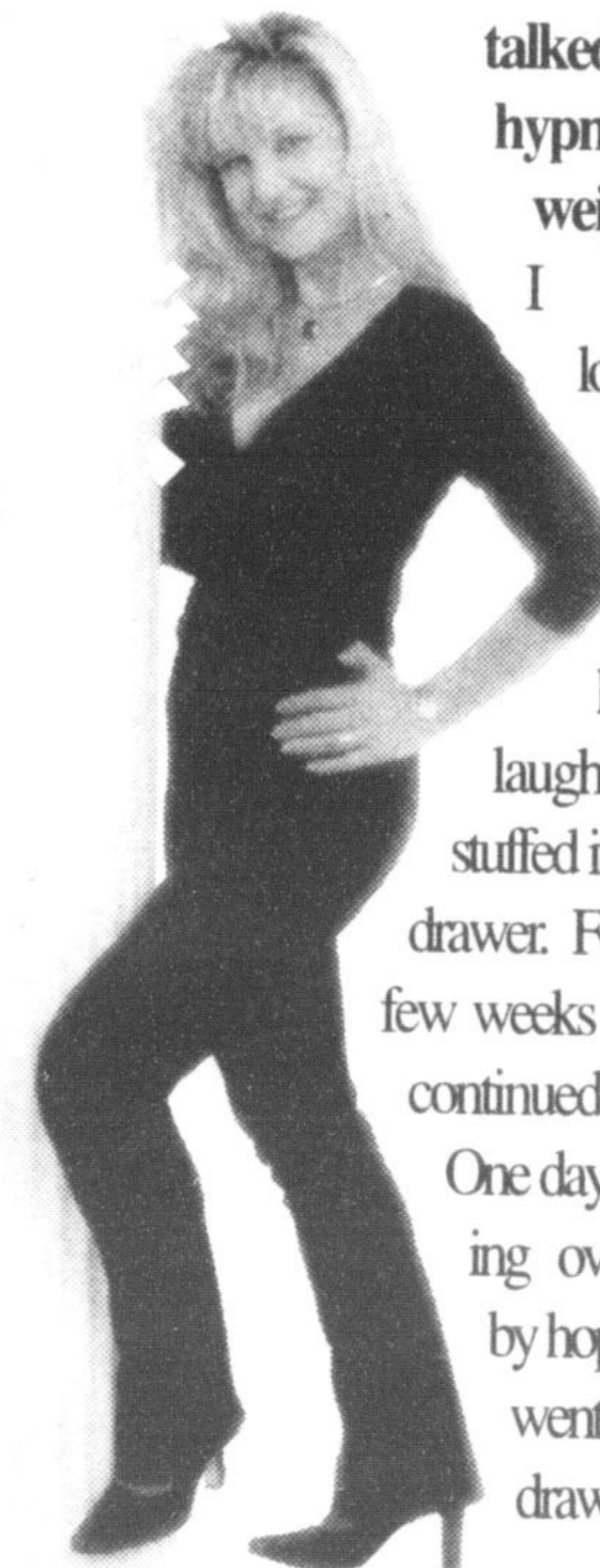
