

Program teaches kids the value of staying in school

Grade 8 students at Holy Rosary School recently received a reality check on the role that staying in school plays in determining their career options and future lifestyles.

On April 23, Junior Achievement of Halton presented its Economics of Staying in School (ESIS) program as part of a oneday blitz throughout Halton, Peel, Toronto and Durham regions.
