million in fees from these rates in 2002.

There was about \$4 million in supplementary taxes, a fancy way of talking about extra money that comes from new homes that pay taxes the Region didn't budget for. These properties came on line later in the year and provided the Region with additional and welcomed monies, Ms MacCaskill said.

Also contributing to the surplus was a good

performance on regional investments, like bonds, which netted extra interest.

Some \$3 million was rolled over from Halton police, which didn't use the money for various capital projects in 2002. Ms MacCaskill said that money will go back into police hands to be used for projects this year.

The bottom line, she said, is the Region budgets for a certain amount of revenue from numerous areas, including supplementary taxes and

water/sewer rates.

"We have to be cautious, that if we don't get the growth, we don't get the costs," Ms MacCaskill said.

"It shows good financial management in that we did not come in at a deficit, that the factors for the surplus are largely environmental."

In 2001, the surplus was \$20 million, mostly due to an increase in supplementary taxes and higher revenue from water and sewer rates.

In 2000, the surplus of a more modest \$7.5 million was also due to spikes in supplementary taxes coming into the Region and increased revenue from water and sewer rates.

The surplus was lower than the last two years because of smaller return rates on regional investments, Ms MacCaskill noted.
