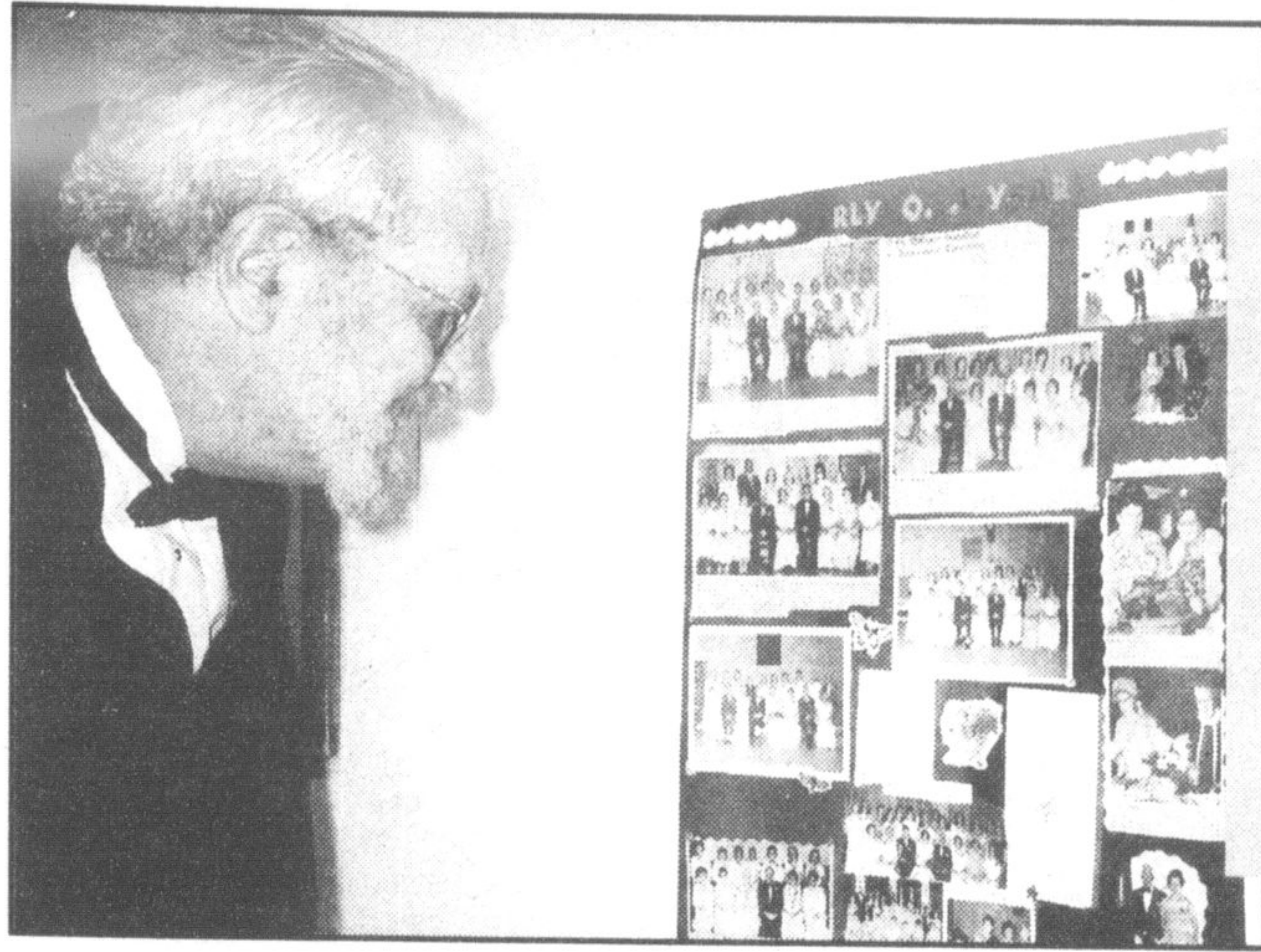


Eastern Star celebrates 50 years of service in Milton

The Halton chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star recently celebrated its golden anniversary — marking 50 years of service in Milton.

The local chapter celebrated its milestone April 26 with a gathering of past and present members at the St. Clair Masonic Lodge on Regional Road 25.

Highlighting the event was a 50-year pin presentation by Edith DeQuetteville to fellow chapter member Lillian Readhead, the only

original member of the group who's still active.

Milton's Eastern Star members also made a \$5,000 donation to the Milton District Hospital Foundation.

The evening's festivities also featured dinner, entertainment, a fashion show of long gowns of the past, and several other presentations — including one by Mayor Gord Krantz, who offered a con-

gratulatory 50-year plaque to the local chapter on behalf of the Town.

Since its inception at Town Hall in 1953, the Milton-based chapter has become an intricate part of the community — doing its share to support the hospital, Halton Women's Place and E.C. Drury School for the Deaf through such initiatives as its penny auctions, card parties and catering special events.
