If I didn't know anything about the Mona Lisa, and happened to see it at a garage sale, I wouldn't pay five bucks for it unless you threw in a cordless telephone.



One is of a busy downtown street in the 1960s at night after a rain, and the other is of these expensive cars in the garage of an expensive modern looking house.


I've been looking for them forever, but I don't think I'll ever find them except at a garage sale.


Art isn't just drawing, of course. I've been racking my brain trying to figure out a form of art I could do ever since I saw these broken plates.

In the meantime, I'd gladly smash a plate and glue it back together for you in exchange for that picture from the '60s with the little red lights.








All of the dancers danced extremely well and impressed the judges and audience with their performance and grace. It was a great finish to a very successful dance season and one that the whole team can be proud of.
