Quickly replacing a shaky Craig Willis — who gave up two goals on as many shots to start the game — the Mavericks' number one netminder stood tall for the balance of the night to keep his teammates in the victory hunt.

Unfortunately, an offensively quiet first period — which plagued the local lads in both games last week — came back to haunt them.


