Notice of Special Planning and Public Works Committee Meeting Amendment No. 18 to the Regional Official Plan Application of Dufferin Aggregates to Permit the Expansion Of the Milton Quarry

The Planning and Public Works Committee met in a special session on the evening of Wednesday, June 11, 2003, to consider the revised Amendment No. 18 to the Regional Official Plan, being the application of Dufferin Aggregates to permit the expansion of its Milton Quarry.

The Committee heard delegations on June 11 and due to the length of the meeting, Committee was not able to debate the matter. Therefore, the Planning and Public Works Committee will reconvene in Special Session on Wednesday, June 18, 2003 at 5:30 p.m. in the Halton Region Council Chambers, 1151 Bronte Rd., Oakville to discuss the matter and make recommendation to Regional Council for its consideration on June 25 at 6:30 pm.

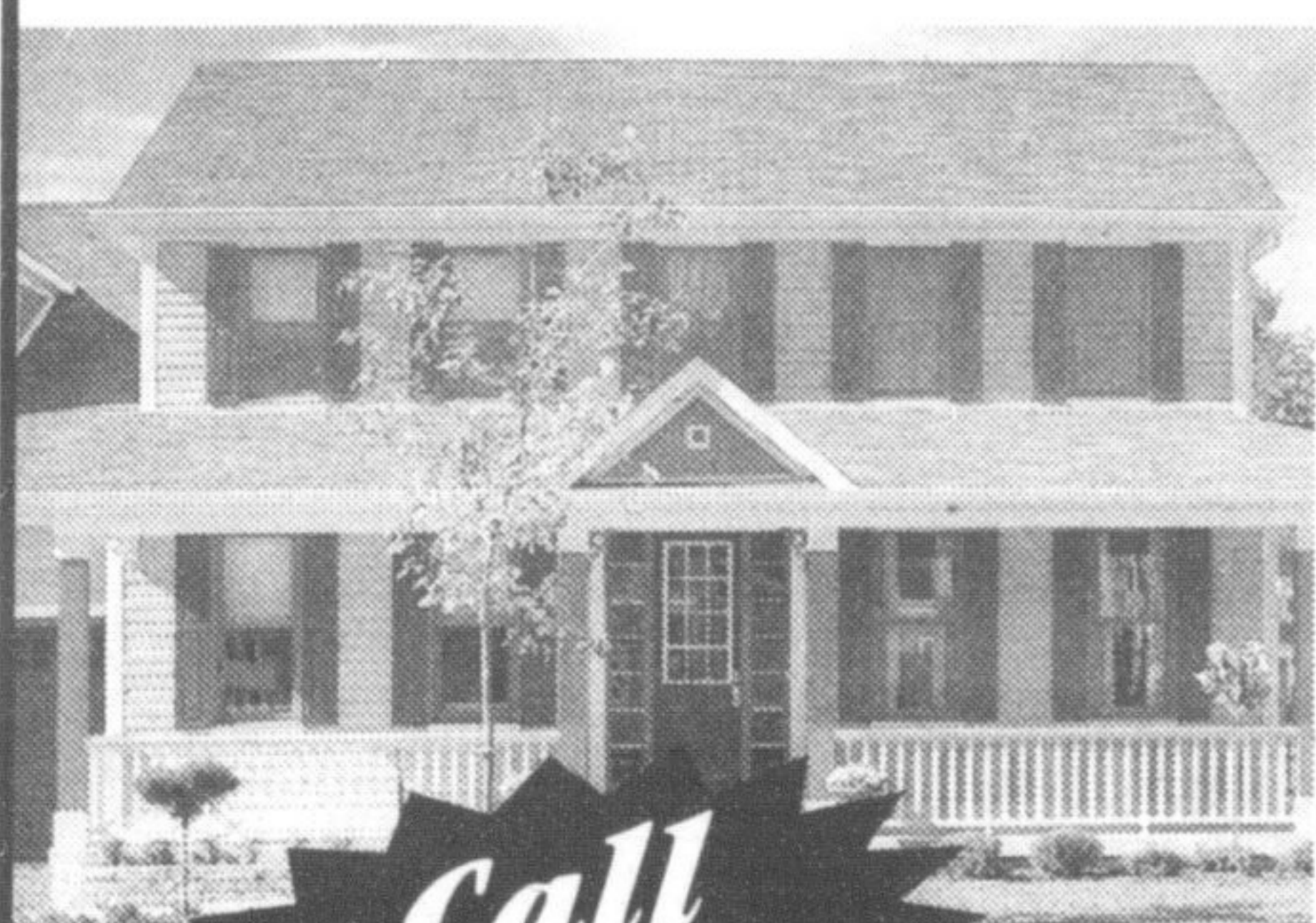
