

New drama club geared for students 10-18 years

Lights, camera, action.

Some of Milton's young people may be one step closer to their dreams of pursuing careers in musical theatre with the arrival of Milton Youth Theatre Productions.

And Milton residents are invited to attend its first information and registration night June 25 from 6 to 8 p.m. at the Milton Leisure Centre.

Milton Youth Theatre Productions is geared towards students aged 10 to 18 years old.

Director Kim Belvedere, a Milton resident, taught dance locally for more than 20 years but decided it was time for a change, she said, adding that she also saw a need for a theatre production.

Classes will begin in September and will provide drama, vocal and musical theatre workshops taught by industry professionals. Each student will perform in a yearend live theatre production.
